Developing Challenges

- **Limited Resources:** There are limited non-congregate Interim Housing options for participants not going to the Mayfair.
- **Other Demobilization Efforts:** Including the Grand, LAHSA staff are coordinating the demobilization of eight (8) Interim Housing programs with a total of over 800 individuals having to be relocated between May 1 – October 31. This is taxing the capacity of the system.
- **Increased Demand for Interim Housing:** In addition to the demand placed on available Interim Housing resources from demobilizing sites, there is increased demand for these resources from other efforts to bring people indoors.
