Comments for Public Posting: Twenty three years ago I was able to purchase a commercial building on Randall Street that I have operated my business out of since that time. I paid to have street lighting installed and curbs & gutters and sidewalks put in along with paving a portion of Randall Street which was required before I could receive my certificate of occupancy. I put in sprinklers and planted grass & trees on the area between the sidewalk and the flood control, I have seen "Tow Away No Parking Between 8:00 PM to 6:00 AM Nightly" installed on both sides of Randall Street between the cul-de sac and Glenoaks Blvd. which was installed to prevent exactly what we have going on right now and what has been happening for the past several years. I have seen the construction of new industrial units across the street and the construction of the L.A. Sanitation Complex, the completion of Randall Street through to Glenoaks. The following is a note from Imelda Padilla taken from a recent email I received "I remain dedicated to addressing the issues that matter most to us as constituents: keeping our streets safe and clean, finding solutions to the homeless crisis," The fact is our street is not clean and our street is not safe and it has not been for several years and it can't be made clean and safe by trying to give something that you don't have to many that don't want it, even if you did have it. You are wanting to put new "No Parking" signs that are less restrictive then the "No Parking" sign that we currently have that are NOT ENFORCED. There was a time when No Parking signs were enforced along with the removal of abandon vehicles, L.A. Sanitation provided street sweeping service and the Sanitation Complex was a well maintained clean facility, the street was clean, customers and employees had a place to park and that community was comprised of hard working, productive, respectful law abiding citizens. Currently the majority of Randall Street is a filthy dirty trash & graffiti ridden dumping ground for people that have no respect for people or property and are absolutely non productive who have no interest or ambition in making Randall Street safe and clean again.
