Issues

Homelessness is an escalating issue in LA, driven by the scarcity of affordable housing.

The absence of affordable housing forces survivors into an agonizing dilemma, where they must choose between enduring an abusive relationship or facing homelessness.

46,240

individuals in the City of LA are homeless

39%

of people experiencing homelessness have experienced intimate partner violence

9%

are homeless due to fleeing domestic/intimate partner violence

More than

14,000

women in the City of LA experience homelessness on any given night



1 in 10 homeless individuals reported being sex or labor-trafficked



1 in 5 homeless youth experienced some form of trafficking

92.3%

of survivors reported experiencing economic abuse and coercion

42%

of survivors report damage to their credit, making it more challenging to achieve financial independence

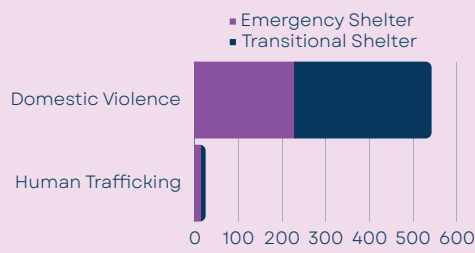

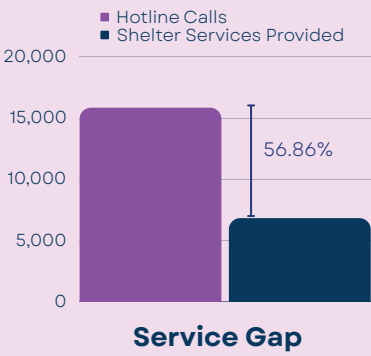
