

**ORDINANCE NO. \_\_\_\_\_**

An ordinance calling a Special Election on Tuesday, March 5, 2024, for the purpose of submitting to the voters of the City of Los Angeles a certified initiative ordinance regarding a minimum wage for employees working at certain healthcare facilities, and consolidating this Special Election with the City's Primary Nominating Election and the State Primary Election to be held on the same date.

**WHEREAS**, on June 10, 2022, the City Clerk presented the City Council with a certified initiative petition in support of the initiative ordinance referenced above;

**WHEREAS**, on June 21 and June 29, 2022, the City Council took action to adopt the initiative ordinance (Ordinance No. 187566) directly as authorized in City Charter Section 452(a);

**WHEREAS**, opponents of Ordinance No. 187566 immediately thereafter circulated a referendum petition against the ordinance;

**WHEREAS**, on September 19, 2022, the City Clerk presented the City Council with a certified referendum petition against Ordinance No. 187566;

**WHEREAS**, on September 30, 2022, the City Council adopted a Resolution, pursuant to City Charter Sections 452 and 462, to submit Ordinance No. 187566 to the voters of the City of Los Angeles at an election to be held together with the City's Primary Nominating Election on March 5, 2024; and

**WHEREAS**, this ordinance formally calls the Special Election for Ordinance No. 187566.

**NOW, THEREFORE,**

**THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LOS ANGELES  
DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. A Special Election is hereby called to be held in the City of Los Angeles on March 5, 2024, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of the City of Los Angeles Ordinance No. 187566, an initiative ordinance regarding a minimum wage for employees working at certain healthcare facilities.

Sec. 2. The complete text of Ordinance No. 187566 is contained in the attachment to the Resolution adopted by the City Council on September 30, 2022 (Council File No. 22-1100-S4).

Sec. 3. The vote requirement for the initiative ordinance to pass is a majority of the votes cast.

Sec. 4. The ballot title and question adopted by the City Council to be used at the Special Election for the initiative ordinance shall be as follows and shall include a letter designation as determined by the City Council in accordance with applicable City and State law:

**MINIMUM WAGE FOR EMPLOYEES WORKING AT CERTAIN HEALTHCARE FACILITIES. INITIATIVE ORDINANCE \_\_\_\_.**

Shall an ordinance establishing a \$25 per hour minimum wage for employees working at certain privately owned healthcare facilities located in Los Angeles (including clinicians, nurses, aides, technicians, maintenance workers, janitorial and housekeeping staff, guards, food service workers, pharmacists, and administrative workers, but not including managers or supervisors), adjusted annually for cost-of-living increases; and providing waivers for employers demonstrating financial hardship; be adopted?

Sec. 5. To vote on the initiative ordinance, the voter shall mark the ballot next to the word "Yes" or the word "No." A "Yes" vote shall be counted in favor of adoption of the initiative ordinance and a "No" vote shall be counted against adoption of the initiative ordinance.

Sec. 6. The Special Election hereby called shall be, and hereby is ordered to be, consolidated with the City's Primary Nominating Election and the State Primary Election to be held in the City of Los Angeles on Tuesday, March 5, 2024.

Sec. 7. The vote centers for the Special Election shall be open as required and during the identified voting period established in the California Elections Code and as administered by the County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk for the State Primary Election.

Sec. 8. The election precincts, vote centers, and officers of election for the Special Election shall be the same as those provided in the City of Los Angeles for the State Primary Election, and the elections shall be held in all respects as if there were only one election. The list or order prepared by the Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk designating election precincts, vote centers, and election officers for the State Primary Election, is hereby approved, incorporated into, and made part of this ordinance.

Sec. 9. The City Clerk shall administer the filing, printing, and distribution of all items contained in the City's Voter Information Pamphlet as provided in the City Election Code, including impartial summaries, ballot arguments, and rebuttal arguments regarding the initiative ordinance. In all other particulars, the Special Election shall be held and conducted pursuant to the laws applicable to elections consolidated with the State Primary Election. The Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles shall have authority to canvass the returns of the Special Election and transmit the certified election results to the City Council.


Sec. 10. The election activities and functions ordered, provided for, and noticed by this ordinance shall not be operative, and this special election shall not be held, if the ballot measure is withdrawn from the ballot not later than 88 days before the election date, as provided in the City Election Code

Sec. 11. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage of this ordinance and have it published in accordance with Council policy, either in a daily newspaper circulated in the City of Los Angeles or by posting for ten days in three public places in the City of Los Angeles: one copy on the bulletin board located at the Main Street entrance to the Los Angeles City Hall; one copy on the bulletin board located at the Main Street entrance to the Los Angeles City Hall East; and one copy on the bulletin board located at the Temple Street entrance to the Los Angeles County Hall of Records.
