

**NAME OF GRANT:** YOUTH CADET COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT FUNDS

It is requested that the Office of Operations, Public Engagement Section, be approved for funds in the amount of \$200,000.00 to support continued community engagement efforts by the Youth Cadet Leadership Program. The approved funds will support the Youth Programs Unit (YPU), which has oversight of the Cadet Program. The funds will maintain the sustainability of year-long activities and equipment (e.g., Cadet Academy, graduations, various team-building events, assistance with Geographical Areas Cadet Post's needs, and uniforms). Additionally, YPU is requesting that \$34,500.00 of the grant be available to use towards graduation Scholarship Awards that will be presented at the upcoming graduations through the end of 2025.

The Youth Cadet Leadership Program is the signature youth program of the Los Angeles Police Department. The program strongly focuses on youth development, youth leadership, and community stewardship. The Youth Cadet Academy lays the foundation for the youth's achievements and success during their recruitment and cadet years, extending into their future beyond the Cadet program.

In 2022, the Cadet Leadership Academy was comprised of 141 cadet recruits. The following year, the class of 3-2023 welcomed 185 cadet recruits, and class 08-2023 had 163 cadet recruits. Due to the dedicated efforts of the Department's Youth Service Officers (YSO) and Youth Program Unit (YPU), this year's class 03-2024 had 210 cadet recruits and class 08-2024 reached 165 recruits. The future of the Cadet Leadership Program is poised for further growth. As our classes continue to expand, we supply each class with uniforms, physical training gear, and other required equipment, all of which necessitate funding.

Currently, our Department boasts an enrollment of 1,047 cadets. In the past, the Department has approved annual activities such as a Disneyland trip, team-building activities, and other memorable events. For some cadets, these activities are entirely new experiences, as many families lack the financial means to support such outings. These activities not only create lasting memories, but also inspire our cadets to share their experiences with family and friends, ultimately encouraging other youth in the community to participate in our program.

The following information is an approximation breakdown on what the funds will support:

Uniforms – 22%

Graduation/Scholarships – 22%

Team Building Activities – 40%

Food and snacks – 12%

Equipment – 4%
