The Elysian Valley Riverside Neighborhood Council is opposed to [CF 22-0392](#) - Digital Signage and echoes the concerns brought forward in Atwater Village's, our neighbor council's, letter. To quote:

*Suggesting that these billboards would "promote roadway efficiency" and "improve public safety" is disingenuous at best. These are advertising billboards that will cause more roadway hazards and light blight than can be offset by Metro's ability to use them for occasional communications.*

In addition to our shared public safety concerns, we believe that the light pollution and quality of life issues, especially for lower-income residents who reside near the affected roadways, need to be strongly considered, as does potential interference with local birds and other wildlife.

We concur with Atwater Village: digital billboards do not belong above the 2 Freeway in our neighborhoods or over our future park spaces. We are opposed to CF 22-0392.
