Neighborhood Council board members are volunteers and it would be helpful if they received confirmation that you received their CIS.

The CIS process was enabled by the to Los Angeles Administrative Code §Section 22.819. It provides that, "a Neighborhood Council may take a formal position on a matter by way of a Community Impact Statement (CIS) or written resolution." NCs representatives also testify before City Boards and Commissions on the item related to their CIS. If the Neighborhood Council chooses to do so, the Neighborhood Council representative must provide the Commission with a copy of the CIS or resolution sufficiently in advance for review, possible inclusion on the agenda, and posting on the Commission's website. Any information you can provide related to your agenda setting schedule is helpful to share with the NC.

If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *listed on the Commission's agenda*, during the time the matter is heard, the designated Neighborhood Council representative should be given an opportunity to present the Neighborhood Council's formal position. We encourage becoming familiar with the City Council's rules on the subject. At the Chair's discretion, the Neighborhood Council representative may be asked to have a seat at the table (or equivalent for a virtual meeting) typically reserved for City staff and may provide the Neighborhood Council representative more time than allotted to members of the general public. They are also permitted up to five (5) minutes of time to address the legislative body. If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *not listed on the agenda*, the designated Neighborhood Council representative may speak during General Public Comments.

Summary: CIS for Council File 23-0957: JEDI Zone for Pacific Avenue The Northwest San Pedro Neighborhood Council supports the creation of a Jobs and Economic Development (JEDI) Zone on Pacific Avenue in San Pedro. This very blighted historic commercial corridor is a heavily traveled thoroughfare for residents and visitors alike. It is vital that we address the conditions of blight and neglect as we move forward with the redevelopment of the waterfront. The proposed area contains the main intersections with important connections to the waterfront, along with some wonderful historic buildings which are unfortunately very blighted. Our Council participated in a community walk, in conjunction with the San Pedro Chamber, to assess conditions on Pacific Avenue and identified many issues. Unfortunately, many of the businesses operating on Pacific are extremely small and do not have the revenue to support the needed improvements.

Not only would the creation of a JEDI Zone provide important tools to help address these issues, but it would also help stimulate much needed economic development.
