The City of Los Angeles offers a reward payable at the discretion of the City Council to one or more persons in the sum or sums up to an aggregate maximum total sum of \$25,000 for information leading to the identification and apprehension of the person or persons responsible for the BREAKING IN TO TWO APARTMENTS, in the City of Los Angeles. On August 1, 2016, at approximately 12:20 p.m., an individual entered into an apartment in East Hollywood and hid behind the door, waiting for the woman who lived in the unit to return from the apartment building's laundry room. When she entered the unit about five minutes later, the suspect attacked her, placing a hand over her mouth and pushing her into a wall, causing her to fall to the ground and scream. After she screamed, the suspect fled the scene. Approximately 90 minutes later, the same suspect entered into an unlocked apartment in Echo Park. The woman who lived in the unit heard her dogs barking aggressively, went to investigate and found the suspect in her living room. The suspect then put his hand inside the woman's blouse and began to fondle her. When she tried to pull away, the suspect pinned her against a couch. The woman's dogs began to attempt to bite the suspect, giving her the chance to push him out of her apartment. Detectives are continuing to investigate this crime, but the suspect has not been identified. The person or persons responsible for this crime represent an ongoing threat to the safety of the people of Los Angeles. Unless withdrawn or paid by City Council action, this offer of reward shall terminate on, and have no effect after, MARCH 5, 2017. The provisions of payment and all other considerations shall be governed by Chapter 12 of Division 19 of the LAAC Code, as amended by Ordinance Nos. 158157 and 166666. This offer shall be given upon the condition that all claimants provide continued cooperation within the criminal justice system relative to this case and is not available to public officers or employees of the City, their families, persons in law enforcement or persons whose misconduct prompted this reward. AVISO DE RECOMPENSA DE \$25,000

La Ciudad de Los Angeles ofrece una recompensa pagadera a la discreción del Concejo de la Ciudad a una o más personas por la suma o hasta una cantidad en conjunto de \$25,000 por información que conduzca a la identificación y detención de la persona o personas responsables por **IRROMPER EN DOS APARTAMENTOS** en la Ciudad de Los Angeles. El 1 de agosto de 2016, aproximadamente a las 12:20 p.m., un individuo entró en un apartamento en East Hollywood y se escondió detrás de la puerta, esperando a que la mujer que vivía en la unidad regresara de la lavandería del edificio de apartamentos. Cuando entró en la unidad cinco minutos más tarde, el sospechoso la atacó, poniéndole una mano sobre su boca y empujándola contra la pared, lo que la hizo caer y gritar. Después de que ella gritó, el sospechoso huyó de la escena. Aproximadamente 90 minutos después, el mismo sospechoso entró en un apartamento abierto en Echo Park. La mujer que vivía en la unidad escuchó a sus perros ladrar agresivamente, fue a investigar y encontró al sospechoso en su sala. El sospechoso luego puso su mano dentro de la blusa e la mujer y comenzó a manosearla. Cuando ella trató de apartarse, el sospechoso la inmovilizó contra el sofá. Los perros de la mujer comenzaron a morder al sospechoso, dándole la oportunidad de empujarlo fuera de su apartamento. Los detectives continúan investigando este crimen, pero el sospechoso no ha sido identificado. La persona o personas responsables de este delito representan una amenaza constante para la seguridad de los habitantes de Los Angeles.
