Recommendation for Council action, pursuant to Motion (Rodriguez - Soto-Martinez):

INSTRUCT the Office of Procurement, in partnership with the Chief Legislative Analyst (CLA), City Administrative Officer (CAO), and General Services Department, to report to Council on a pilot program for the distribution of an all-in-one fentanyl detection devices that can be distributed to residents throughout Los Angeles at no cost and funded through the Opioid Settlement funding.

Fiscal Impact Statement: Neither the CAO nor the CLA has completed a financial analysis of this report.
