Neighborhood Council board members are volunteers and it would be helpful if they received confirmation that you received their CIS.

The CIS process was enabled by the to Los Angeles Administrative Code §Section 22.819. It provides that, "a Neighborhood Council may take a formal position on a matter by way of a Community Impact Statement (CIS) or written resolution." NCs representatives also testify before City Boards and Commissions on the item related to their CIS. If the Neighborhood Council chooses to do so, the Neighborhood Council representative must provide the Commission with a copy of the CIS or rResolution sufficiently in advance for review, possible inclusion on the agenda, and posting on the Commission's website. Any information you can provide related to your agenda setting schedule is helpful to share with the NC.

If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *listed on the Commission's agenda*, during the time the matter is heard, the designated Neighborhood Council representative should be given an opportunity to present the Neighborhood Council's formal position. We encourage becoming familiar with the City Council's rules on the subject. At the Chair's discretion, the Neighborhood Council representative may be asked to have a seat at the table (or equivalent for a virtual meeting) typically reserved for City staff and may provide the Neighborhood Council representative more time than allotted to members of the general public. They are also permitted up to five (5) minutes of time to address the legislative body. If the CIS or resolution pertains to a matter *not listed on the agenda*, the designated Neighborhood Council representative may speak during General Public Comments.

Summary: On behalf of the more than 40,000 stakeholders of Palms, the Palms Neighborhood Council supports City Council Motion CF23-1391 to address embodied carbon in the built environment. In order for the City to meet ambitious GHG emission reduction targets, it is imperative to address carbon emissions from building materials. Overlapping areas of the Exposition Transit Neighborhood Plan, Palms is currently experiencing a development boom and increase in density. The community impact of development is on display in our community. Greenhouse gas emissions, however, are invisible and often an afterthought when there is a development boom. We must change that if we are to meet the Sustainable City Plan for all buildings to be net zero by 2050 and the City's commitment to reducing embodied carbon for major construction by 50% before 2030. We are particularly enthusiastic for the Whole Building Life Cycle Analysis

component of the motion as introduced, which is an essential step for sustainability in building practice. CF23-1391 should generate the kind of needed policy that must become enforceable within the Los Angeles Green Building Code to meet the needs of Palms and Los Angeles. For these reasons, we fully support this motion and ask that it be approved.
