I am submitting this public comment in strong support of reinstating former Los Angeles Fire Department (LAFD) Chief Kristin Crowley. Her removal was not only a loss to the department but to the entire city of Los Angeles. Chief Crowley was an exceptional leader who modernized LAFD operations, improved emergency response times, and championed diversity and accountability.

It is concerning that Mayor Karen Bass justified Chief Crowley's termination by stating she was "acting in the best interests of Los Angeles' public safety, and for the operations of the Los Angeles Fire Department." However, in 2024, the Mayor's administration cut \$17.6 million from the LAFD budget, directly impacting resources, staffing, and overall emergency response capabilities.
