You are hereby notified that the Planning and Land Use Management (PLUM) Committee of the Los Angeles City Council will hold a public hearing in-person on **Tuesday, April 22, 2025** at approximately **2:00 P.M.**, or soon thereafter, in the John Ferraro Council Chamber, Room 340, City Hall, 200 North Spring Street, Los Angeles, CA 90012 (entrance on Main Street), to consider the following: Categorical Exemption from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines, Article 19, Section 15332 (Class 32), and related CEQA findings; report from the Los Angeles City Planning Commission (LACPC); and, an Appeal filed by Elaine Johnson (L.A.
