SUBJECT:

Initiation of Vacation Proceedings - Camino De Solana (Portion of Easterly Side) Northerly of Camino De La Cumbre - VAC - E1401450

RECOMMENDATIONS:

- A. That upon adoption of this report, the vacation proceeding to vacate Camino De Solana (portion of easterly side) northerly of Camino De La Cumbre, as shown on Exhibit A, be initiated pursuant to California Streets and Highways Code, Division 9, Part 3, Public Streets, Highways and Service Easements Vacation Law.
- B. That the Bureau of Engineering be directed to investigate the feasibility of this vacation request.
- C. That the Bureau of Engineering present its report regarding the feasibility of vacating the requested area to the Public Works Committee.

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT:

A deposit of \$5,000 was paid by the petitioner for the investigation of this request pursuant to Section 7.42 of the Administrative Code. Any deficit fee to recover the cost pursuant to Section 7.44 of the Administrative Code will be required of the petitioner.

DISCUSSION:

The petitioner and owner, Geoffrey Case and Barbara Dourmashkin-Case, are requesting the City to vacate Camino De Solana (portion of easterly side) northerly of Camino De La Cumbre, to incorporate it into the corresponding lots for their use.

The petitioner had previously requested the vacation of this area via Council file no. 87-2210. However, the petitioner did not complete certain conditions of approval at the time, thereby terminating their request in January 2001. The petitioner has requested the City to take into consideration previously completed conditions during the review and consideration of the current street vacation request.

The adoption of the recommendations herein does not constitute or imply approval of the vacation.
