Comments for Public Posting: This motion lays bare the intentions of developers, power players, and Olympic boosters who have dragged the boondoggle here to Los Angeles and we should all oppose it. The Olympics are always used as an excuse to build things communities don't want. She's found a tidier way to enable the development her campaign fundraisers demand, without all the hubbub of an historically over-budget mega-event that causes economic strife and human pain wherever it goes. If you combine this motion with plans like the Festival Trail, venues, events, viewing centers, and fan zones will stretch throughout the city. We can expect the abuse of this deregulation to encroach on the lives of Angelenos from every neighborhood and displace Angelenos from every council district. The right choice for Los Angeles, in the wake of the fires, is still to cancel these Olympics, but the least you can do is stop this brazen attempt to enable harmful development throughout the city. We know what this motion is about and we know you're all going to approve it, but
