In 2018 the Los Angeles City Council passed the Home Sharing Ordinance, which prohibits the short-term rental of any unit of housing other than one's primary residence. This ordinance was necessary to undo the conversion of a significant portion of the City's housing stock from long-term to short-term rentals, which was exacerbating the City's affordable housing crisis.

However, since implementation, this ordinance has only been minimally enforced. There are still many units which flagrantly violate the ordinance listed on short-term rental platforms.

The Echo Park Neighborhood Council **SUPPORTS** this motion, which instructs the Planning Department to draft a report proposing how the deficiencies in the City's enforcement of the Home Sharing Ordinance can be addressed.

### **RESOLUTION**
