Comments for Public Posting: I strongly support the proposed laws prohibiting sidewalk camping. Such sidewalk camping has resulted in 5--and consistently rising--daily homeless deaths in LA, and essentially assured the inevitable degradation of the physical and mental health of the other homeless living on the streets; countenanced intolerable physical obstacles to the intended --and otherwise universally encouraged--safe public use of the sidewalks, most severely impacting the disabled; constitutes a governmental abdication respecting --and inevitable invitation encouraging-- an environment that permits drug peddling , prostitution, and other human trafficking to flourish and propagate in our City, and encourages homeless migration from other jurisdictions which have responsibly addressed and enforced laws prohibiting sidewalk camping; has rendered impossible or economically infeasible healthy and essential commercial uses in significant sections of the City; and led or ultimately will result in affected residents fleeing or consider abandoning their continued presence in Los Angeles.
