REPORT BACK REGARDING SPECIAL FUND INTEREST DISCREPANCY

Honorable Councilmembers:

RECOMMENDATION

We have reviewed the record and determined that the Office of Finance is correct; interest earned in Fund 842 is distributed to the General Fund.

SUMMARY

This responds to recommendation #1 passed by the City Council on April 30, 2014 (CF 13-0600-S133) instructing the Department of Animal Services to reconcile the discrepancy of interest earned in the Animal Sterilization Fund (842) being distributed to the Animal Sterilization Fund, as reported in Attachment G of the joint report of the Controller and the CAO, or to the General Fund, as reported by the Office of Finance.

The Department accepted a series of significant, multi-year reductions in annual allocation transferred from the General Fund to the Animal Sterilization Fund. As a result we are considering requesting your support for a change in the ordinance to direct future interest distributions to the Animal Sterilization Fund to offset reductions in the allocation. Retaining the interest earned would provide for 400 additional sterilization surgeries annually.





Subject: **CITY ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER – Special Funds Interest Reporting**

The City Council instructed specified departments to conduct a review of interest earnings distribution on special funds, to reconcile differences on interest earning disbursements with the Office of Finance, and to provide a report to the Office of the Controller, City Administrative Officer (CAO), Chief Legislative Analyst and the Budget and Finance Committee (C.F. No. 13-0600-S133).

The CAO has conducted a complete review of interest earnings distribution on those funds with identified discrepancies. Findings and recommendations are summarized below.

The following Funds have a zero balance and were closed on June 30, 2014:

Fund 116 – 2003 Tax Revenue Anticipated Note Proceeds
Fund 117 – 2004 Tax Revenue Anticipated Note Proceeds
Fund 118 – 2005 Tax Revenue Anticipated Note Proceeds
Fund 658 – Community Facilities District 3 Silver Oaks Deposit

Fund 429 – Greater Los Angeles Visitors and Convention Bureau Trust Fund: Recommend that interest be credited to the General Fund.

Fund 438 – Construction Services Trust Fund: This Fund requires review and analysis by the City Attorney to determine the proper attribution of interest earnings. Recommend that the CAO work with the City Attorney and report separately on this Fund.

Fund 45B - Parks First Trust Fund: This Fund was included inadvertently in the report.

Fund 492 – Special Fire Safety and Paramedic Communications Equipment Tax Fund: This Fund requires review and analysis by the City Attorney to determine the proper attribution of interest earnings. Recommend that the CAO work with the City Attorney and report separately on this Fund.

Fund 876 – Pershing Square Special Trust: Interest disbursement is governed by Los Angeles Administrative Code Sec. 5.115.8(a) and the Special Tax Agreement dated August 1, 1992 between the City and Community Facilities District No. 1. After construction costs and

debt service payments have been made, then investment earnings shall, from time to time, be transferred to the City's General Fund. Since Fund 876 has had sufficient funds to cover debt service, it has been feasible to credit past interest earnings to the General Fund. The CAO will continue to work with the Office of Finance to ensure sufficient funds are available to pay debt service before interest earnings are disbursed from this Fund.

A summary of the revised interest earnings distribution for the special funds administered by the CAO is presented below:





Per Council File 13-0600-S133 which was adopted on April 29, 2014, the Office of the City Clerk was instructed to review Attachment G in order to clarify discrepancies pertaining to interest earnings on various trusts funds currently administered by the Office of the City Clerk.

Our Office had previously indicated that the trust funds listed below did not accrue interest into the City's General Fund. After reviewing the funds and getting further clarification, these funds do in fact accrue interest into the City's General Fund.

Fund 436 – Special Reward Trust Fund
Fund 441 – Furtherance of International Earthquake Conference Goals Trust Fund
Fund 45V- Intellectual Property Trust Fund
Fund 46G – Illegal Dumping Reward Program Trust Fund
Fund 51K- Michael Jackson Memorial Trust Fund
Fund 531 – Lopez Canyon Amenities Trust Fund
Fund 659 Business Improvement District Trust Fund

It should be noted that we are currently working on an amendment to the Administrative Code for the Business Improvement Trust Fund, Fund 659, so that all future interest is allocated to the Trust Fund.

**SUBJECT: COMPREHENSIVE REVIEW OF THE CITY'S SPECIAL FUNDS –
DEPARTMENT OF CONVENTION AND TOURISM DEVELOPMENT**

Pursuant to the Council Action, adopted on April 29, 2014, and the Budget and Finance Committee Report relative to a comprehensive review of the City's special funds (C.F. No. 13-0600-S133), the Los Angeles Department of Convention and Tourism Development (CTD) was to reconcile the disbursement of interest earnings for the funds administered by the CTD and provide a report to the Office of the Controller, City Administrative Officer (CAO), Chief Legislative Analyst (CLA), and the Budget and Finance Committee. CTD administers two (2) funds listed on Attachment G – Interest Reporting Discrepancy of the joint Controller and CAO report:

- A. The Los Angeles Convention and Exhibition Center Authority Revenue Fund (Fund No. 724) was established by Resolutions No. 123 and No. 124, adopted by the Los Angeles Convention Center Authority Commission (Authority). The Authority was created by Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement between the City of Los Angeles and the County of Los Angeles (JEPA) to provide for (a) "the construction and operation of a

convention and exhibition hall and related facilities, including any expansion or enlargement thereof” and (b) “the acquisition and development of properties near the Convention and Exhibition Center. The interest earned on Fund No. 724 balances has been credited to the General Fund and CTD is not requesting changes to this practice at this time.

- B. The creation and the administration of the Convention Center Revenue Fund (Fund No. 725) is set forth in Division 8, Chapter 11, Section 8.148 of the Los Angeles Administrative Code (LAAC), for the purpose of operating the Los Angeles Convention Center (LACC). The interest earned on Fund No. 725 balances has been credited to the General Fund, and CTD is not requesting changes to this practice at this time.

Los Angeles Charter and Administrative Code

Sec. 8.148. Establishment and Operation of "Convention Center Revenue Fund."

All revenues derived from any such municipal auditorium, municipal auditorium center, convention center or facilities in connection therewith, including the proceeds from any lease thereof, shall be paid, at the direction of the Executive Director of the Convention Center, into either accounts maintained by the private entity under contract with the City to manage, operate and maintain the Convention Center, or into a special fund to be designated as the "**Convention Center Revenue Fund**", which fund is hereby established. The expenses of operation, management, maintenance and improvement of any such municipal auditorium, or municipal auditorium center, convention center or the facilities in connection therewith, shall be defrayed solely from the Convention Center Revenue Fund and the revenues or other moneys paid into the same or appropriations budgeted for such purposes to the Los Angeles Convention Center Department, or from accounts maintained by the private entity under contract to manage, operate and maintain the Convention Center. Moneys in the Convention Center Revenue Fund, or in the accounts maintained by the private entity, shall be appropriated or used only as follows:

First: For the necessary expenses of operating, managing, maintaining and improving any such municipal auditorium or municipal auditorium center, convention center, or facilities in connection with any such facilities and discharge of liabilities arising therefrom.

Second: For the payment of the principal and interest, or either, due or coming due, during the fiscal year in which the money in said fund account is received, or to be received upon outstanding bonds or other evidences of indebtedness, such as lease agreements made by the City to repay such indebtedness issued for the acquisition, construction, or completion of any municipal auditorium, or municipal auditorium center, convention center, or facilities in connection therewith.

Third: To transfer to the Reserve Fund in the manner provided in Section 382 of the Charter; provided, however, that no such transfer shall be made as long as any bonds or other evidences of indebtedness payable out of said revenue fund shall be outstanding and unpaid, or so long as the City is obligated to make payments on a lease which guarantees debt service of bonds or other evidences of indebtedness issued to construct a municipal auditorium, or municipal auditorium center and the facilities in connection therewith, or until there shall have been set apart in a special trust fund, established for such lease payments, bonds or other evidences of indebtedness, sums sufficient to pay, when due, rental payments for the unexpired term of any such lease, and the entire principal of any such indebtedness remaining unpaid, together with interest accrued and to accrue thereon.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

1. That Series B of said issue of Bonds in the amount of \$20,500,000 should be offered for sale, sold and delivered as soon as practicable.
2. That the Commission hereby authorizes the invitation of bids for the purchase of said Series B, such invitation to be substantially in accordance with the notice inviting bids attached hereto. Said notice inviting bids, the bid form and the memorandum of interest requirements, attached hereto and by this reference incorporated herein, are hereby approved.
3. That the Secretary shall cause said notice inviting bids to be published substantially in the form attached hereto in "The Los Angeles

Daily Journal", a newspaper published and of general circulation in Los Angeles, California, by at least two insertions, the last publication to be at least five days prior to the day fixed for the receipt of bids. The Secretary is also hereby directed to cause the said notice to be published at least once in the daily edition of "The Bond Buyer", a newspaper published in New York, New York, not less than ten days prior to the day fixed for the receipt of bids, but failure to so publish said notice in New York or any defect in such publication shall not invalidate, or in any manner affect the proceedings for the sale of the Bonds.

4. That the terms and conditions of the offering and sale of the Bonds shall be as specified in said notice inviting bids.

5. That the Secretary is hereby authorized and directed to cause to be furnished to prospective bidders a reasonable number of copies of the notice inviting bids, the bid form with the memorandum of interest requirements, the pamphlet entitled "Basic Legal Documents" and also, when the same is approved at a later meeting, the Official Statement.

6. That the Secretary is hereby authorized and directed to receive and record the receipt of all bids made pursuant to said notice inviting bids, to publicly open and read said bids, to cause said bids to be examined for compliance with said notice, to cause computations to be made as to which bidder has bid the lowest interest cost and to present such bids to this Commission as provided in said notice along with a report as to the foregoing and any other matters deemed pertinent to the award of the Bonds and the proceedings for the issuance thereof. The Secretary is hereby authorized and directed to request the assistance of any officers and employees of the City, or the consultants, counselors and auditors in the accomplishing of the foregoing and to incur any necessary expenses in connection therewith.

RESOLUTION OF THE LOS ANGELES CONVENTION AND EXHIBITION CENTER AUTHORITY COMMISSION SUPPLEMENTING RESOLUTION NO. 38 IN ORDER TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF SERIES B OF THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF BONDS AUTHORIZED BY SAID RESOLUTION NO. 38

WHEREAS, This Commission has adopted that certain Resolution entitled:

"Resolution of the Los Angeles Convention and Exhibition Center Authority Commission Constituting the Indenture of the Los Angeles Convention and Exhibition Center Authority Providing the Terms and Conditions for the Issuance of its Revenue Bonds -- Initial Issue \$38,500,000"

; and

WHEREAS, of said initial issue of \$38,500,000, \$18,000,000 thereof has been issued as Series A and it is now necessary to issue the remaining \$20,500,000 as Series B;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, DETERMINED AND ORDERED BY THE LOS ANGELES CONVENTION AND EXHIBITION CENTER AUTHORITY COMMISSION, as follows:

Section 1. That the \$20,500,000 of Bonds authorized to be issued as Series B by said Resolution No. 38 shall be dated February 1, 1969, and shall mature on February 1 in each year of maturity in the amounts for each of the several years as follows:

Section 2. On or before the closing (delivery of the Bonds) the Construction Contract will be executed and subsection A of Section 4.01 of said Resolution No. 38 will have no force or effect. When the Bonds are printed, the "Provisions for Call and Redemption Prior to Maturity" shall be altered to reflect said fact.

Section 3. Subsection A(c) of Section 5.02 of said Resolution No. 38 shall be amended to read as follows:

"(c) *Working Capital Fund.* Commencing after the initial Land Rental and/or Base Rental under the Lease is paid and thereafter following each January 15, provided that the next July 15 transfer to the Interest Fund plus any "carry over" required by the Bond service schedule has either been made, or there has been retained in the Revenue Fund sufficient moneys therefor, the Controller shall transfer to a special fund, designated as the "Los Angeles Convention and Exhibition Center Authority, Working Capital Fund" (herein sometimes referred to as the "Working Capital Fund") to the extent available, sums sufficient as determined by the Controller for the payment of:

(i) All taxes and assessments of any nature whatsoever for which the Authority is liable, including, but not limited to, excise taxes, ad valorem taxes, ad valorem and specific lien special assessments and gross receipts taxes, if any, levied upon the Project or upon the Authority's interest therein or upon Authority's rental income derived therefrom.

(ii) All expenses (not otherwise paid or provided for out of the proceeds of the sale of Bonds of the Authority) incidental to the issuance and reissuance of the Bonds, including, without limitation, their servicing, registration, deregistration, exchange, transfer and call and redemption prior to maturity, and all administrative costs of the Authority and all other necessary administrative charges of the Authority or charges required to be paid by it in order to comply with the terms of the Bonds or of this Resolution and to defend the Authority and its members.

(iii) Insurance premiums, if any, on all insurance, or deposits to special funds in lieu thereof, required or permitted under the provisions of Section 10 of the Lease, or otherwise.

(iv) All costs and expenses which the Authority may incur in consequence of or because of any default by the City under the Lease, including reasonable attorneys' fees and costs of suit or action at law to enforce the terms and conditions of the Lease.

(v) All sums necessary to maintain an amount of \$5,000 in the Working Capital Fund.

The Controller shall, pursuant to subsection (c) of Section 4 of the Lease, demand from the City any balance of the amounts due to pay any of the foregoing items, (i) through (v), when the same become due and, upon receipt of same, deposit such amounts in the Working Capital Fund."

Section 4. Subsection B of Section 6.04 of said Resolution No. 38 shall be amended to read as follows:

"B. Authority shall keep or cause to be kept a policy or policies of insurance against loss or damage to the property covered by the Resolution resulting from fire, lightning, vandalism, malicious mischief, riot and civil commotion and such perils ordinarily defined as 'extended coverage' and other perils as Authority and the City may agree should be insured against on forms and in amounts satisfactory to each. Such insurance shall be maintained in an amount not less than the full insurable value of the properties, subject to deductible conditions of not to exceed \$10,000 for any one loss. The full insurable value shall be determined from time to time but not less frequently than once in every thirty-six (36) months. The Authority shall also:

(a) Keep or cause to be kept the property covered by the Resolution insured:

(i) Against war risks, as and when such insurance is obtainable from reputable insurance companies of the United States of America or any agency thereof, in an amount not less than eighty percent (80%) of the then full insurable value thereof; and

(ii) Against loss or damage from leakage of sprinkler systems now or hereafter installed therein in amounts to be determined by Authority; and

(ii) Against loss or damage by explosion of steam boilers, pressure vessels and similar apparatus now or hereafter installed therein in amounts to be determined by Authority; and

(b) Keep or cause to be kept the Project insured by earthquake insurance (if such insurance is obtainable on the open market from reputable insurance companies) in amounts not less than the full insurable value of the properties with deductibles and at premiums considered to be reasonable by Authority; or, in lieu thereof, Authority may, at any time, with the consent of the City, establish an "Earthquake Reserve Fund" to be invested in Authorized Securities, as directed by Authority, proceeds from the sale of which shall be used as provided in subsection E of this Section. Amount of such contributions to such Earthquake Reserve Fund shall be at least \$25,000 annually for the first four (4) years and at least \$15,000 annually thereafter so that there shall be established and thereafter maintained in such Fund at least \$500,000. Any amount in such Fund shall be used to retire the last outstanding Bonds.

(c) Maintain or cause to be maintained use and occupancy or business interruption or rental income insurance against the perils of fire, lightning, vandalism and malicious mischief and such other perils ordinarily defined as 'extended coverage' in an amount equal to not less than three (3) years rental; and

(d) Maintain or cause to be maintained public liability insurance against claims for bodily injury or death to persons, or damage to property of others occurring upon, in or about or in any way connected with the operation of the Project, such insurance to afford protection to a limit of not less than \$500,000 with respect to injury or death to any one person, not less than \$2,000,000 prior to the first event held in the Project which is attended by the public, and not less than \$10,000,000 thereafter, with respect to injury or death to any number of persons in any one occurrence, and property damage liability insurance in an amount not less than \$1,000,000 in any one occurrence; and

(e) Maintain or cause to be maintained workmen's compensation insurance issued by a responsible carrier authorized under the laws of the State of California to insure employers against liability for compensation under the Workmen's Compensation Insurance and Safety Act now in force in California, or any act hereafter enacted as an amendment or supplement thereto or in lieu thereof, such workmen's compensation insurance to cover all persons employed in connection with the Project and to cover full liability for compensation under any such act aforesaid, based upon death or bodily injury claims made by, for or on behalf of any person incurring or suffering injury or death during or in connection with the Project or the business of the Authority."



The Department of Cultural Affairs (DCA), in reference to Council File 13-0600-S133, is reporting back to your committee on the disposition of interest earnings associated with two of the DCA's special funds: Fund 337 - Cultural Affairs Grant Trust Fund and Fund 844 - Cultural Affairs Trust Fund. At this time, the Department concurs with the Office of Finance's assessment that interest earnings attributed to balances on these funds are credited to the General Fund. Neither fund receives interest revenue, and the governing documents for these funds do not explicitly address interest requirements. In particular, the financial management standards for most federal grants received by DCA stipulate that costs may be incurred only during the grant period and all obligations liquidated immediately thereafter. Therefore, in practice, any interest accrual should be minimal.

A handwritten signature in black ink, appearing to be "Theresa Patzakis", is written over the "FROM:" line of the memorandum.

You have requested advice as to whether LACERS is entitled to the interest earned on a special fund, Fund 800, which provides for operating expenses for the plan, and if so, what actions, if any are necessary to properly credit LACERS on a going forward basis. The average balance of Fund 800 has run around \$1.5 million. Upon review by the Controller, it was discovered that interest on Fund 800 is being credited to the City's General Fund rather than to LACERS. Consistent with the Controller's recommendation, LACERS would like to ensure that interest earned on Fund 800 is properly credited to LACERS.

The Los Angeles Administrative Code (LAAC) §1110 governs this subject. LAAC §1110(a) authorizes LACERS' establishment of a special fund, LAAC §1110(b) establishes LACERS' control of such a fund and § 1110(d) provides that earnings are to be credited to LACERS.¹ The City's legislative scheme does not require Council or Board action to properly credit LACERS with fund earnings. Rather, the Treasurer is obligated to comply with the requirements of the LAAC.

As we discussed, interest earned in the past and credited to the General Fund rather than to LACERS would have been accounted for by the actuary in determining the City's annual contribution, hence recovery of past interest earned is unnecessary.

¹ LAAC § 1110 states in its entirety:

(a) **Special Funds.** Each pension and retirement board shall have a special trust fund or funds on deposit with the Treasurer for the purpose of segregating its revenues from the other money of the City.

(b) **Control of Special Funds.** The board of each pension and retirement system shall have control over their respective funds. Transfers or expenditures shall be drawn upon funds only upon demands signed by the chief accounting employee of the board. All payments from the funds shall be made upon demands prepared and approved in accordance with the provisions of the Charter.

(c) **Master Trustee or Custodian.** Each pension and retirement board, in its sole discretion, may designate one or more master trustees or custodians to hold securities and funds of the system for the purpose of carrying out the investment policies and decisions of the board.

(d) **Fund Earnings.** The money in any pension or retirement system fund shall be invested at the sole and exclusive direction of the respective board and all earnings shall be credited to the respective funds by the Treasurer or the Master Trustee or Custodian designated by the respective board.

Recommendations for Council action:

INSTRUCT departments listed on Attachment G of the joint Controller and City Administrative Officer (CAO) report, attached to the Council file, and the Office of Finance to reconcile the disbursement of interest earnings for the funds listed and conduct a complete review of interest earnings distribution on all funds, and provide a report to the Office of the Controller, CAO, Chief Legislative Analyst, and the Budget and Finance Committee on the results of the review on all funds.
2. INSTRUCT departments to work with the Office of the Controller to determine the funds that should be closed and complete the necessary steps.

Fiscal Impact Statement: The Controller and CAO report that adoption of the above recommendations would result in no immediate impact to the General Fund. The Controller's Office, as part of the annual audit work plan, will undertake more in-depth reviews of a number of funds which may identify opportunities to offset the General Fund burden in the future. Currently, the CAO is reviewing the list of funds for potential balances that may be included as part of the 2014-15 budget.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

SUMMARY

At its meeting of April 7, 2014, the Budget and Finance (BF) Committee considered a joint Controller and CAO report dated March 19, 2014 relative to a comprehensive review of the City's special funds. The Controller and CAO report that on July 29, 2013, the BF Committee requested that the Offices of the Controller and CAO provide an in-depth report on special funds. This request followed discussions during the 2013-14 Budget process regarding the \$42.6 million that had accumulated in the Transportation Grant Fund since 1996 due to reimbursements not being transferred to the General Fund.





RE: Earnings for LAFPP Special Funds

You have requested advice as to whether LAFPP is entitled to the interest earnings derived from several special funds established for the payment of pension benefits for Tiers 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6, and if so, what actions, if any, are necessary to properly credit LAFPP on a going forward basis. The LAFPP special funds in question are established in the Los Angeles Administrative Code and include:

Fund 801 Fire & Police Pension Tier 1 Service Pension
Fund 802 Fire & Police Pension Tier 1 General Pension
Fund 803 Fire & Police Pension Tier 2 Service Pension
Fund 804 Fire & Police Pension Tier 2 General Pension
Fund 805 Fire & Police Pension Tier 3 Service Pension
Fund 806 Fire & Police Pension Tier 3 General Pension
Fund 909 Fire & Police Pension Tier 4 Service Pension
Fund 910 Fire & Police Pension Tier 4 General Pension
Fund 915 Fire & Police Pension Tier 5 Service Pension
Fund 916 Fire & Police Pension Tier 5 General Pension
Fund 920 Fire & Police Pension Tier 6 Service Pension
Fund 921 Fire & Police Pension Tier 6 General Pension

The collective balance of the referenced special funds is approximately \$1.9 million. Upon review by the Controller, it was discovered that earnings from these named special funds are being credited to the City's General Fund rather than to LAFPP. Consistent with the Controller's recommendation, LAFPP would like to ensure that earnings are properly credited to LAFPP.

Los Angeles City Charter §1110 governs this subject. Charter §1110(a) authorizes LAFPP's establishment of a special fund; LAAC §1110(b) establishes LAFPP's control of such a fund; and § 1110(d) provides that earnings are to be credited to LAFPP.¹ Additionally, each corresponding Los Angeles Administrative Code (LAAC) provision establishing the respective special funds similarly provides for the crediting of all interest, earnings and profits to the named fund. LAAC §§1320, 1416, 1510, 1610, 4.2010, 1710. The City's legislative framework does not require Council or Board action to properly credit LAFPP with fund earnings. Rather, the Treasurer is obligated to comply with the requirements of the LAAC and credit earnings to the corresponding respective special fund. To the extent special fund earnings were improperly credited in the past, such would have been accounted for by the actuary in determining the City's annual contribution, hence recovery of past earnings is unnecessary.

¹ Charter § 1110 states in its entirety:

(a) **Special Funds.** Each pension and retirement board shall have a special trust fund or funds on deposit with the Treasurer for the purpose of segregating its revenues from the other money of the City.

(b) **Control of Special Funds.** The board of each pension and retirement system shall have control over their respective funds. Transfers or expenditures shall be drawn upon funds only upon demands signed by the chief accounting employee of the board. All payments from the funds shall be made upon demands prepared and approved in accordance with the provisions of the Charter.

(c) **Master Trustee or Custodian.** Each pension and retirement board, in its sole discretion, may designate one or more master trustees or custodians to hold securities and funds of the system for the purpose of carrying out the investment policies and decisions of the board.

(d) **Fund Earnings.** The money in any pension or retirement system fund shall be invested at the sole and exclusive direction of the respective board and all earnings shall be credited to the respective funds by the Treasurer or the Master Trustee or Custodian designated by the respective board.





Section 1. Chapter 108 is hereby added to Division 5 of the Los Angeles Administrative Code to read:

CHAPTER 108

**STANDARDS AND TRAINING
FOR CORRECTIONS TRUST FUND**

Sec. 5.508. Creation and Administration of Fund.

(a) There is hereby created within the Treasury of the City of Los Angeles a special trust fund known as the "Standards and Training for Corrections Trust Fund", hereinafter referred to in this Chapter as the "Fund".

(b) The purpose of the Fund is for the receipt, retention and disbursement of moneys disbursed to the City of Los Angeles by the State of California from the Corrections Training Fund established pursuant to Penal Code Section 6040 in connection with and in furtherance of the state mandated standards and training of local correctional and probation officers. Funds shall be disbursed in accordance with the restrictions and requirements set forth in Sections 299 and 301 of Title 15 of the California Code of Regulations and other related sections.

(c) The Fund shall be administered by the Chief of Police or his or her designee.





**THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LOS ANGELES
DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. Chapter 73 is added to Division 5 of the Los Angeles Administrative Code to read:

CHAPTER 73

**LOS ANGELES POLICE DEPARTMENT
TRAINING AND EVALUATION MANAGEMENT SYSTEM II SPECIAL FUND**

Sec. 5.465. CREATION AND ADMINISTRATION OF THE TEAMS II FUND.

(a) There is hereby created within the Treasury of the City of Los Angeles (City) a special fund known as the Los Angeles Police Department Training Evaluation and Management System II (TEAMS II) Special Fund (TEAMS II Fund). The TEAMS II Fund shall be used for the deposit and expenditure of monies designated by the Mayor and Council for the purpose of implementing the TEAMS II Development Program as necessary to comply with the TEAMS II related provisions of the Consent Decree (Decree) entered into between the City and the United States Department of Justice, with an effective date of June 15, 2001, in regards to reforms within the Los Angeles Police Department (Department). The TEAMS II Fund monies shall be expended for TEAMS II Development Program activities, including, but not limited to, defraying all or a portion of the costs of contracting, and making payments on contracts, for the development of the Risk Management Information System and other TEAMS II Development Program related applications, the procurement of system hardware and software, improvements and enhancements to the LAPD network infrastructure necessary to accommodate the TEAMS II applications, and other services necessary to implement the TEAMS II Development Program. The Mayor, or his or her designee, and the Chief Legislative Analyst (CLA) shall administer, have overall management, and expend monies in the Fund.

(b) The Mayor, or his or her designee, and the CLA may delegate to the Department the authority to expend monies necessary to implement the TEAMS II Development Program. The Department shall report on a bi-annual basis to the Mayor, Council, and the CLA regarding and identifying all expenditures of the TEAMS II Fund, as well as the purposes for which the expenditures were made. Each report shall be submitted within 60 days after the close of each reporting period.

(c) All interest and earnings attributable to the TEAMS II Fund shall be devoted to the purposes of the TEAMS II Fund. At the close of each fiscal year, surplus monies in the TEAMS II Fund shall remain in the TEAMS II Fund and shall not revert to the Reserve Fund.] ✓



SUMMARY

At its meeting of December 7, 2009, the Budget and Finance Committee considered the CAO's report relative to the 2009-12 COPS American Recovery and Reinvestment Act Grant. The LAPD is requesting authority to accept the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act Grant Award for the 2009 CHRP, in the amount of \$16,285,650. The CHRP is a competitive grant program that provides funding directly to law enforcement agencies to create and preserve jobs and to increase community policing capacity and crime prevention efforts. The Grant will provide partial funding for 50 officers for three years, and the City will be required to maintain the funding for those officers in the fourth year. The CAO reports that acceptance of the grant in accordance with the recommendations contained in this report will: (1) ensure the City's ability to hire to attrition and maintain an authorized deployment of at least 9,963 officers which is consistent with the adopted budget and recent Council motions; (2) provide for the opportunity to adjust the LAPD workforce based on future budget actions; (3) maximize the utilization of grant resources; and (4) minimize the City's financial risk in the fourth year when obligated to provide full funding for the 50 positions.

Fiscal Impact Statement: The CAO reports that acceptance of the grant award will provide \$749,624 in federal funds to finance the procurement of Hand-Held Auto Citation Devices. A City match of \$249,874 will be required in the 2003-04 Fiscal Year. The funding source for the City match is yet to be determined.

Summary:

The Mayor's Office of Criminal Justice Planning (OCJP) requests approval of a grant award under the COPS MORE (Making Officer Redeployment Effective) 2002 program. The award total is \$749,624 for the purchase of Hand-Held Auto Citation Devices (HHCD). The grant period is from August 1, 2002 through July 31, 2003. The granting agency is the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ), Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS). COPS MORE 2002 is a new grant and is discrete from previous COPS MORE awards.

COPS MORE 2002 would finance up to 75 percent of the cost of equipment, technology, or civilian salaries and must result in an increase in field patrol time. The balance of the cost is considered a City match. The total amount for this program is \$999,498 with the City responsible for \$249,874 of that amount. Projected costs include \$766,400 for 221 HHCDs; \$232,098 for supplies; and \$1,000 for consulting.

The proposed intent of the HHCDs is to speed the process of Traffic Citations, Field Interviews (FI), and Field Data Reports (FDR). In addition, it is proposed that the HHCDs would allow for electronic transfer of data into appropriate databases (Traffic Information System, Automated Field Interview System, and the Pedestrian STOP system). The HHCDs would have a magnetic-strip capable of reading drivers' licenses. Officers would only have to enter data not embedded in the license's magnetic stripe. The HHCDs would potentially save officer time in the field, reduce errors, and make information available to officers and detectives more quickly. Currently, LAPD utilizes a paper form for data collection.

Although there are many potential advantages to adopting this technology, there are also several unknowns: (1) what the ongoing costs might be associated with maintenance, upgrade, and replacement of hardware and software; (2) what training will be required; and (3) what additional support staff might be required.

However, it does not appear that there is sufficient time to fully analyze the ramifications of adopting this new technology prior to the City accepting this grant award. DOJ has recently notified OCJP that the City must act on this grant award as soon as possible.

Subject: COPS MORE 2002 Grant Award

SUMMARY

The Mayor's Office of Criminal Justice Planning (OCJP) has transmitted for approval the grant award for the COPS MORE (Making Officer Redeployment Effective) 2002 program. The award total is \$749,624 for the purchase of Hand-Held Auto Citation Devices (HHCD). The grant period is from August 1, 2002 through July 31, 2003. The granting agency is the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ), Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS). COPS MORE 2002 is a new grant and is discrete from previous COPS MORE awards.

COPS MORE 2002 would finance up to 75 percent of the cost of equipment, technology, or civilian salaries and must result in an increase in field patrol time. The balance of the cost is considered a City match. The total amount for this program is \$999,498 with the City responsible for \$249,874 of that amount. Projected costs include \$766,400 for 221 HHCDs; \$232,098 for supplies; and \$1,000 for consulting.

The proposed intent of the HHCDs is to speed the process of Traffic Citations, Field Interviews (FI), and Field Data Reports (FDR). In addition, it is proposed that the HHCDs would allow for electronic transfer of data into appropriate databases (Traffic Information System, Automated Field Interview System, and the Pedestrian STOP system). The HHCDs would have a magnetic-strip capable of reading drivers' licenses. Officers would only have to enter data not embedded in the license's magnetic stripe. The HHCDs would potentially save officer time in the field, reduce errors, and make information available to officers and detectives more quickly. Currently, LAPD utilizes a paper form for data collection.

Although there are many potential advantages to adopting this technology, there are also several unknowns: (1) it is unknown what ongoing costs might be associated with maintenance, upgrade, and replacement of hardware and software; (2) it is unknown what training will be required; and (3) it is unknown what additional support staff might be required.

However, it does not appear that there is sufficient time to fully analyze the ramifications of adopting this new technology prior to the City accepting this grant award. DOJ has recently notified OCJP that the City must act on this grant award as soon as possible. The timing of this grant award further complicates analysis as the City is in the process of accepting bids for Portable Officer Data Device Systems (PODDS), which is a similar hand held device.

OCJP indicates that the City might consider purchasing PODDS with the dual capability of issuing auto-citations. The Police Department supports this idea. PODDS is proposed to be designed for the capture of vehicle and pedestrian stop and Field Interview data. The PODDS Request For Proposal also indicates options that the City may choose to pursue, including integration of a portable printer, magnetic stripe reading, and the ability to produce citations. The cost of the citation options for PODDS is not known at this time, thus the number of auto-citation capable devices that the City can purchase for \$999,498 is also unknown. Integrating this technology holds several apparent advantages such as reduction in the number of devices Police Officers will be required to carry and the ability to populate data across various forms without duplicate entry by the Police Officer. At this time, it is unknown if any disadvantages may result from integrating the technology.

It is anticipated that a contract for PODDS will be executed by June 2003, but development of the device may take another six to eight months. Because the terms of the COPS MORE 2002 grant require expenditure of funds within one-year of grant acceptance, an attempt to integrate the PODDS technology may jeopardize the COPS MORE 2002 funds. As the purchase of this technology will not take place until next fiscal year, it is recommended that the \$249,874 City match be placed in the 2003-04 City Budget, allowing additional time to identify potential special fund sources as an alternative to using General Fund money.

Despite the risk of losing grant funds, it is in the City's best interests to integrate with PODDS. It is recommended that the OCJP, with the assistance of the Police Department, coordinate with DOJ to allow the use of COPS MORE 2002 grant funds to purchase auto-citation technology in coordination with PODDS.

RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Council, subject to the approval of the Mayor:

1. Approve, and authorize the Mayor to execute on behalf of the City, a COPS MORE 2002 grant award from the Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services in the amount of \$749,624, for the period of August 1, 2002 through July 31, 2003, subject to the approval of the City Attorney as to form and legality;
2. Authorize the Controller to establish new appropriation accounts within the COPS MORE Special Revenue Fund No. 650 for the receipt and disbursement of grant funds;
3. Request the Mayor's Office of Criminal Justice Planning, with the assistance of the Police Department, to coordinate with the United States Department of Justice to allow the use of COPS MORE 2002 grant funds to purchase auto-citation technology in coordination with the Police Officer Data Device Systems project;

4. Request the Mayor's Office of Criminal Justice Planning, with the assistance of the City Administrative Officer, to identify whether the required \$249,874 City match may be special funded and to propose including the matching funds in the 2003-04 City Budget; and,
5. Direct the Police Department, prior to expending COPS MORE 2002 funds, to present to the Mayor and Council for approval, an expenditure and implementation plan and an analysis of the ongoing costs and additional staffing needs associated with the procurement of auto-citation devices.

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT

The proposed acceptance of the grant award will provide \$749,624 in federal funds to finance the procurement of Hand-Held Auto Citation Devices. A City match of \$249,874 will be required in the 2003-04 Fiscal Year. The funding source for the City match is yet to be determined.





Reports as follows:

RECOMMENDATION

In order to provide for the establishment of a trust fund for unclaimed gambling money, your Committee RECOMMENDS, substantially as recommended by the Board of Police Commissioners, that the accompanying proposed ordinance, approved as to form and legality by the City Attorney, BE PLACED UPON ITS PASSAGE.

SUMMARY

As indicated by the Chief of Police in his report dated December 21, 1983, attached to file, gambling monies are seized and booked as evidence in connection with arrests for criminal activity and are not claimed.

Currently, the Police Department is required by Government Code Section 50050 to retain unclaimed money for a period of three years. This mandatory retention period has added to the burdens of storage and security as well as depriving the General Fund of additional revenue accrued from an interest-bearing fund.

The proposed ordinance would allow the Department to retain the money for six months and then transfer the unclaimed balance to a special trust fund where it would remain for the balance of the three-year holding period. During this three-year holding period, individuals would still be able to claim their monies while deposited in this trust fund. In Fiscal Year 1983, the Department deposited \$200,000 into the General Fund. If this proposed ordinance had been in effect and the monies deposited with the City for 2 1/2 years, the City Treasurer could have earned \$56,602.80, at the current annual percentage rate of 10.01% compounded monthly.



Records show that interest has not been crediting to the funds listed above and LA SAN does not intend to take any action to change that.



This correspondence responds to Instruction No. 1 of Council File (CF) 13-0600-S133, a comprehensive review of the City's special funds. The Los Angeles Department of Transportation (LADOT) was identified in Attachment G of the joint Controller and City Administrative Officer Report with regards to the Wilshire West Transportation Improvement Trust Fund No. 462, the Bicycle Plan Trust Fund No. 55C, and the Petroleum Violation Escrow Account Trust Fund No. 868. Subsequent instructions by the Controller's Office instructed departments to report on the discrepancies identified in Attachment G by September 8, 2014.

The LADOT reviewed the appropriate ordinances and determined that interest earned by the Wilshire West Transportation Improvement Trust Fund, Petroleum Violation Escrow Account Trust Fund, and Bicycle Plan Trust Fund should have been retained by the Special Fund. Details are listed below.

Wilshire West Transportation Improvement Trust Fund No. 462

Ordinance 167551 authorized the creation of the Wilshire West Transportation Improvement Trust Fund on January 21, 1988. Section 10, titled Wilshire West Transportation Improvement Trust Fund, page 32 of the Ordinance states that "any interest earned" shall be deposited in the Wilshire West Transportation Improvement Fund. By Ordinance, interest earned was not to be deposited in the General Fund. The Wilshire West Transportation Improvement Trust Fund should not have been included in Attachment G.

The Wilshire West Transportation Improvement Fund was also identified by the Controller's Office as an inactive fund. The Department has agreed and recommended that this fund be closed and that its cash balance of \$11,189.42 be transferred to the Neighborhood Traffic Management Fund. The City Council authorized this recommendation in the FY 2014 Year End Financial Status Report (CF 13-0600).

Petroleum Violation Escrow Account Trust Fund No.868

The City Council adopted CF 87-0361 on June 27, 1990. Council Action No. 4 authorized the Controller to establish the Petroleum Violation Escrow Account Trust Fund and provided that any interest by the fund should be used by the Smart Streets Corridor Project. The Smart Streets Corridor Project evolved into the City's ATSAC Program.

The Petroleum Violation Escrow Account Trust Fund experienced no activity from 2002 onwards. The LADOT recommended that the fund be closed and that the cash balance of \$258,251.78 be transferred to the Automated Traffic Surveillance and Control (ATSAC) Center Fund. The City Council authorized this recommendation in the FY 2014 Year End Financial Status Report (CF 13-0600).

Bicycle Plan Trust Fund No. 55C

The City Council adopted Ordinance No. 182272 (see CF 10-2385-S5) on November 13, 2012. Section 5.115.10 (h) provides that interest earned should remain with the Bicycle Plan Trust Fund.

Whereas, the Mayor and Council previously authorized the Department of Transportation (DOT) participation in and staffing for the Los Angeles County Transportation Commission (LACTC) sponsored Santa Monica Freeway Corridor Smart Streets Demonstration Project; and

Whereas, the Smart Streets Project establishes a coordinated traffic management system along a 12.3 mile segment of the Santa Monica Freeway between Soto Street and the Santa Monica City limits by linking existing communication systems. Upon implementation of this Project DOT will have the ability to coordinate traffic movement in the Santa Monica Freeway Corridor with other agencies during peak travel periods and to reroute traffic during special events, accidents and periods of construction activity; and

Whereas, the City share of the Phase 1 of this Project is \$18 million and DOT has identified funding sources through regional Federal Aid Urban (FAU) funds (\$12.1 million), interest on FAU funds (\$4.4 million) and Petroleum Violation Escrow Account (PVEA) (\$1.4 million) and various additional sources are being investigated by LACTC as the coordinating agency for the Project; and

Whereas, funds from interest on FAU funds and PVEA have been earmarked from LACTC for this project pending City approval of the proposed Cooperative Agreements to implement coordinated traffic projects; maintain and operate equipment purchased with these funds; and conduct a study of low cost Transportation System Management (TSM) improvements and implement all feasible study findings; and

Whereas, this project is fully reimbursable from the above funding sources. Therefore all expenditures must be front-funded with City funds, The City funds are replenished as reimbursement is received usually within two to three weeks; and

Whereas, additional space will be required in the ATSAC Control Center when the Smart Streets Corridor Project becomes operational in the late 1992. Redesign of the existing ATSAC Control Center will be required by 1991 to allow for construction bidding process and the physical construction. The redesign will be accomplished by consultant services at a cost of \$25,000 due to existing workload of the Bureau of Engineering Architectural Division. The contractual services cost is entirely reimbursable from PVEA funds; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I MOVE, as recommended by the City Administrative Officer, subject to the approval of the Mayor:

1. Approve the proposed Cooperative Agreement between the City

and the Los Angeles County Transportation Commission, for reimbursement to the City of FAU Interest Funds in the amount of \$4,419,500, for implementation of the Santa Monica Freeway Corridor Smart Streets Demonstration Project and authorize the Mayor to execute the Agreement on behalf of the City;

2. Relative to the acceptance of the above referenced \$4,419,500 in FAU Interest Funds, direct the General Manager of the Department of Transportation to:
 - A. Cooperate with neighboring jurisdictions to implement coordinated traffic signal control across jurisdictional signal projects, where feasible;
 - B. Maintain and operate the equipment purchased with these funds; and
 - C. Conduct a study of low cost Transportation System Management (TSM) improvements, including, but not limited to peak hour parking and turn restrictions, that can be implemented in conjunction with the project; and, to implement all findings of the study found to be feasible and warranted based on engineering criteria and fiscal capacity, contingent on any improvements Council approval, prior to installation of improvements.
3. Approve the proposed Cooperative Agreement between the City and the Los Angeles County Transportation Commission, for reimbursement to the City of Petroleum Violation Escrow Account (PVEA) Funds in the amount of \$1,430,564, for implementation of the Santa Monica Freeway Corridor Smart Streets Demonstration Project and authorize the Mayor to execute the Agreement on behalf of the City;
4. Authorize the Controller to establish a special fund entitled the Petroleum Violation Escrow Account (PVEA) Trust Fund to be administered by the Department of Transportation. All monies paid into the Fund and any interest earned thereon shall be used for the Smart Streets Corridor Project;
5. Authorize the Bureau of Engineering to advertise, award, and execute, subject to review by the City Attorney, a personal services contract for the redesign of the ATSAC Control Center, and direct the Bureau of Engineering and any other involved agency to expedite the design and construction of the ATSAC Control Center so as to complete the expansion and remodeling by August 1, 1991; and,
6. Transfer of \$448,344 from the Reserve Fund to the Unappropriated Balance and appropriate this amount therefrom to the Department within the General Fund No. 100 as indicated below and as detailed in the CAO report for the 1989-90 Fiscal Year, subject to reimbursement for eligible items from PVEA Funds, Regional FAU Funds and FAU Interest Funds:

An ordinance adding Article 26 to Chapter 5 of Division 5 of the Los Angeles Administrative Code, establishing the Bicycle Plan Trust Fund.

**THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF LOS ANGELES
DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:**

Section 1. A new Article 26 is added to Chapter 5 of Division 5 of the Los Angeles Administrative Code to read as follows:

CHAPTER 5, ARTICLE 26

BICYCLE PLAN TRUST FUND

Sec. 5.115.10. Creation and Administrative of the Fund.

- (a) There is hereby created and established in the Treasury of the City of Los Angeles a special fund to be known as the "Bicycle Plan Trust Fund" (Fund).
- (b) The purpose of the Fund shall be the receipt, retention and disbursement of funds, including developer contributions, received by either the Los Angeles Department of City Planning or the Los Angeles City Department of Transportation designated for the formulation and implementation of bicycle improvements, to facilitate more efficient management and administration of the funds. The Fund shall also be used for the disbursement of monies transferred into the Fund by the City Council.
- (c) The Fund shall be administered by the General Manager of the Department of Transportation (General Manager) or the General Manager's designee(s), in accordance with established City practices and the provisions of the Fee Mitigation Act (Government Code section 66000, *et seq.*). No more than 5% of monies in the Fund shall be used per year for administrative costs. Administrative costs shall not include public outreach, traffic studies, feasibility studies, traffic data surveys, conceptual drawings, construction drawings, construction engineering, and construction.
- (d) Disbursement of funds requires the approval of the Director of the Department of City Planning (Director) and the General Manager, or their designees.
- (e) The General Manager shall inform the Controller of any special condition or restriction imposed upon any monies accepted for deposit in the Fund.
- (f) The General Manager is authorized to establish procedures to carry out the provisions of this Article.
- (g) Monies not expended from the Fund at the close of any fiscal year shall not revert to the Reserve Fund, but shall remain in the Fund.


(h) All interest and other earnings attributable to monies in the Fund or to any of the separate accounts within the Fund shall be credited to the Fund or to the account to which it is attributable and shall be devoted to the purposes of the Fund.

(i) The General Manager shall maintain appropriate accounting records of the actual costs of the services rendered pursuant to the Fund. The General Manager shall report to the City Council regarding and identifying all receipts into, and all expenditures out of, the Fund as well as the purpose for which the expenditures were made. Each report shall cover a fiscal year and shall be submitted within 90 days after the close of that fiscal year.



DECLARATION OF POSTING ORDINANCE


