Re: Letter of Support for a Flavored Tobacco Sales Prohibition

Dear President Martinez:

The Tobacco Education and Research Oversight Committee (TEROC) is a legislatively mandated oversight committee that monitors the use of Proposition 99 and Proposition 56 tobacco tax revenues for tobacco control, prevention education, and tobacco-related research in California.^{1,2} TEROC advises the California Department of Public Health (CDPH), the University of California (UC), and the California Department of Education (CDE) with respect to policy development, integration, and evaluation of tobacco education programs funded by Proposition 99 and Proposition 56.

TEROC strongly supports efforts to prohibit the sale of all flavored tobacco products and supports policies that do not exempt products, including mint, menthol, or hookah.

Flavored tobacco products entice new and young smokers as they come in sweet and fruit flavors, colorful packaging and are sold at low, affordable prices. These products often mimic popular candies and drinks in both packaging and flavor, making them particularly appealing to youth.³ Flavored tobacco products are a gateway for many youth and young adults to become regular smokers because flavors disguise the harshness of tobacco and make smoking seem less harmful.⁴ In Los Angeles County, 83 percent of high school students who used a tobacco product in the last 30 days used a flavored tobacco product in 2018.⁵ This is consistent with statewide trends in youth tobacco use in California: 86.4 percent of youth tobacco users in California reported using flavored tobacco products in 2018, with over 86 percent of high school users reporting use of a flavored electronic smoking device (such as electronic cigarettes, vapes, vape pens, e-hookah, hookah pens) and almost 90 percent reporting use of flavored hookah.⁵ Young adults under the age of 30 in California use e-cigarettes and hookah at a higher rate compared to older adults.⁶ The Food and Drug Administration also states that 97 percent of current youth e-cigarette users used flavored tobacco products in the past month.⁷

Policy interventions focused on protecting youth and young adults are particularly critical because most individuals start using tobacco as minors or young adults. Some efforts to prohibit tobacco flavors have excluded menthol flavoring. **TEROC recommends the inclusion of mint and menthol with other flavors so that all flavored tobacco products are prohibited.** Menthol, a common flavor in many tobacco products and cigarettes, masks the harsh taste of tobacco and makes the smoke easier to inhale.⁸ The anesthetizing effect of menthol in cigarettes also makes it easier and more appealing for youth and new users to start using tobacco.⁸ For years, the tobacco industry has marketed menthol cigarettes to the African American community; lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and queer (LGBTQ) communities; and other vulnerable populations which use menthol tobacco products at higher rates.⁹



In 2018, mint was a top flavor among 12 to 24 year old JUUL users who had used JUUL in the past 30 days.¹⁰ JUUL has since removed flavored products from retail stores except for mint, menthol, and tobacco flavors; however, preliminary 2019 National Youth Tobacco Survey data indicates mint and menthol e-cigarette use increased from 51 percent to 64 percent among high school students, suggesting youth switched to mint when other fruit flavors were harder to find.⁷

In addition to mint and menthol, hookah should not be exempted from flavored tobacco product policies. According to the World Health Organization (WHO), hookah smoke contains measureable levels of carcinogens, nitric oxide, heavy metals, and carbon monoxide. Studies show that smoking hookah leads to elevated heart rate and blood pressure, impaired lung function, lung inflammation, and acute carbon monoxide poisoning. Secondhand hookah smoke has been shown to be harmful and studies have shown that it contains higher levels of carbon monoxide, PAH, and ultrafine particles than cigarette smoke.^{11,12} The WHO indicates that hookah smokers inhale as much smoke in one session as a cigarette smoker inhales with 100 cigarettes.¹³

Flavored e-cigarette products pose a threat to public health as very few of the chemicals in these products have undergone adequate toxicity or safety testing for acute or chronic inhalation. According to a literature review conducted by the CDPH's Environmental Health Investigations Branch, numerous published studies show that e-cigarette aerosols and e-liquids possess the ability to cause respiratory irritation, inflammation, and toxicity to lung cells.^{14,15} One chemical in particular, diacetyl, has also been associated with the severe respiratory disease, bronchiolitis obliterans, which damages cell lining and causes scarring in the lungs.¹⁶ Another possible concern is that these chemicals may have unknown consequences when they interact with each other or with other environmental chemicals. There is evidence that one chemical in a mixture can modulate certain toxicities in another chemical in the same mixture.¹⁷

As of February 7, 2020, 75 California jurisdictions have adopted policies to prohibit or restrict the sale of flavored tobacco products and in September 2019, Los Angeles County approved an ordinance that prohibited the sale of all flavored tobacco products, including menthol, in unincorporated areas. TEROC strongly encourages the Los Angeles City Council to follow Los Angeles County's steps in protecting the community by supporting a ban on all flavor tobacco products.

TEROC's support of prohibiting the sale of all flavored tobacco products is consistent with TEROC's 2018-2020 Master Plan, [*New Challenges, New Promises for All*](#), Recommendation 2: Eliminate Tobacco-Related Disparities and Recommendation 4: Protect Youth and Young Adults. In the Master Plan, TEROC recommends that all local jurisdictions adopt ordinances that prohibit or restrict sales of flavored and/or menthol tobacco products.

To Whom It May Concern:

Camino Nuevo Charter Academy serves 3,600 students in Los Angeles in a college preparatory program to be literate, critical thinkers, and independent problem solvers who are agents of social justice with sensitivity toward the world around them. As part of our mission, we work to ensure that students are able to thrive in their communities. The proliferation of electronic cigarettes and flavored tobacco products in the neighborhoods we serve puts the health and well-being of children and youth at risk. As such, we support strong, effective regulation and enforcement policies to reverse an epidemic in youth e-cigarette use and reduce youth use of other tobacco products. As such, we support restricting the sale of flavored tobacco products.

The U.S. Surgeon General warns that the significant increase in tobacco use, attributed to an increase in electronic cigarette use among youth, is an epidemic, and 80% of young people who have ever used tobacco started with a flavored tobacco product. Further, adolescents are more vulnerable to the addictive properties of nicotine and can show symptoms of serious nicotine addiction within weeks or just days after experimenting with smoking. We believe that the City of Los Angeles should be a leader in advancing health outcomes by limiting the impact of tobacco use on public health. Specifically, the City of Los Angeles should have the means to prohibit the sale of all flavor tobacco products, including menthol, and the licensure of tobacco retailers near schools and other youth sensitive areas. Strong enforcement of tobacco related policies has been shown to reduce illegal sales of tobacco to youth and young adults and help reduce youth smoking rates.

We request the City of Los Angeles support protecting youth by restricting the sale of flavored tobacco products.

A study from American Lung Association found that over 5,700 kids start vaping every day. Studies also show that most kids who start using flavored tobacco products move on to smoking regular cigarettes later in life, and consequently increasing their risk for developing cardiovascular diseases.

In conclusion, we ask for your support in passing the flavored tobacco ban (Council File 18-1104). As youth, we are deeply concerned for our peers, families, and younger generations who may become addicted for life due to the various candy-flavored tobacco products. We urge you all to consider the health and well-being of the youth and families you serve, and protect our communities from the harsh consequences of flavored tobacco products and long-term nicotine addiction.
