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Comments for Public Posting: I ask the City Council allocate an additional \$200M of COVID-19 federal relief funds to the Los Angeles Homelessness Roadmap - specifically for the LAHSA Recovery Plan - and that all resources dedicated to the Roadmap, including those related to the Judge Carter settlement, go toward solutions that will bring our unhoused neighbors inside permanently. The City Council should align its funding plan with the LAHSA Recovery Plan. The County has already dedicated over \$300 million and LAHSA says that \$200 million can come from existing funds. Please add \$200 million to the effort to house fifteen thousand of the most vulnerable in our City. Move-in ready units are available across the city for rapid rehousing and shared housing. In addition, motels and hotels across the City are available to be acquired or leased. We know the housing stock is there. Please put the money behind ensuring these units are available for our unhoused neighbors in need. Don't spend those dollars on Pallet Shelters, Safe Parking, or sanctioned encampments. The CDC does not recommend moving people from encampments unless you have somewhere to safely house them. We have an opportunity to bring our neighbors into permanent homes right now. Please do the right thing and align your Roadmap with the LAHSA Recovery Plan to ensure that fifteen thousand currently unhoused Angelenos have a place to call home. You have the power to permanently end their homelessness.
