REWARD NOTICE

The City of Los Angeles offers a reward payable at the discretion of the City Council to one or more persons in the sum or sums up to an aggregate maximum total sum of \$50,000 for information leading to the identification and apprehension of the person or persons responsible for the SHOOTING DEATH OF OMAR MEDINA in the City of Los Angeles. On February 21, 2020, 27-year old Omar Medina was assaulted by ten people while attending a party at 12732 Montague Street in Pacoima. During this assault, three of the attackers shot Mr. Medina multiple times. The suspects then fled, leaving Mr. Medina laying face down in the backyard. Los Angeles Fire Department personnel arrived on scene and attempted to revive Mr. Medina, but were unsuccessful and he was declared dead at the scene. Detectives continue to investigate this crime but have been unable to identify the suspects. The detectives believe a reward may compel members of the public to provide information on the person or persons responsible for this crime. The person or persons responsible for this crime represent an ongoing threat to the safety of the people of Los Angeles, therefore, it is appropriate for the City of Los Angeles to offer a reward for information leading to the identification, apprehension and conviction of the person or persons responsible for this crime. Unless withdrawn or paid by City Council action, this offer of reward shall terminate on, and have no effect after, FEBRUARY 20, 2021. The provisions of payment and all other considerations shall be governed by Chapter 12 of Division 10 of the LAAC Code, as amended by Ordinance Nos. 158157 and 166656. This offer shall be given upon the condition that all claimants provide continued cooperation within the criminal justice system relative to this case and is not available to public officers or employees of the City, their families, persons in law enforcement or persons whose misconduct prompted this reward.
