Prop F was a bond measure passed to in 2000 to build, expand, and renovate the city's animal shelters. The San Fernando Valley was supposed to have 3 shelters but one was already given to a rescue. If West Valley is also given away, that would leave only one shelter to serve over 1.5 million people and 260 square miles in the SFV and that is not acceptable. Please do the right thing and let us tax payers have a voice and choice. Thank you.
