The City should utilize existing definitions of High Need Communities in programs such as Vision Zero and Safe Routes to School to provide funding back into communities impacted by unsafe public spaces. Set minimums, not maximums, for bus shelter installation. The City should look to get as many new bus shelters installed as possible, especially as LA continues to warm due to climate change, by setting minimum benchmark progress with defined penalties for failing to meet the marks.
