**SUMMARY**

On August 26, 2020, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) notified the Los Angeles Fire Department (LAFD) of an award of funds from the Fiscal Year 2020 (FY 2020) Port Security Grant Program (PSGP) for Marine Firefighter Training. The FY 2020 PSGP will provide a total of \$303,483 in funding for the backfill of staff on overtime, course tuition, and training-related consumables and equipment. The FY 2020 PSGP is a cost-share reimbursement grant. The Federal share of the grant is 75% (\$227,612), with a 25% (\$75,871) cost match provided by the LAFD. The performance period for the FY 2020 PSGP is September 1, 2020 through August 31, 2023.

The purpose of the PSGP funding is to support the National Preparedness Goals as set forth in the Presidential Policy Directive 8. The National Preparedness (PPD-8) describes the Nation's approach to preparing for the threats and hazards that pose the greatest risk to the security of the United States. Specifically, the objective of the National Preparedness Goal is a secure and resilient Nation with the capabilities required across the whole community to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to, and recover from the threats and hazards that pose the greatest risk. PSGP funding is awarded to strengthen the nation's critical maritime infrastructure against risks associated with potential terrorist attacks.

The FY 2020 PSGP will fund Marine Firefighter 1 and 2 training courses and related training exercises. Authority is being requested to negotiate and execute a contract with a vendor to conduct the training courses provided to LAFD members and our regional port partners.

## **RECOMMENDATIONS**

That the Board:

1. Forward to the Mayor for approval, acceptance and authority to expend FY 2020 Port Security Grant Program funding for Marine Firefighter Training to fund staffing (backfill/overtime), course tuition, and training-related consumables and equipment; and
2. Request that the City Council:
  - a. Accept the FY2020 Port Security Grant Program funding in the amount up to \$303,483 from LAFD Special Training Fund 40J, Account 3840JB, in accordance with the FY 2020 PSGP award from FEMA, for the performance period of September 1, 2020, through to August 31, 2023, and any extension of the performance period granted by FEMA; and authorize the Fire Chief, or designee, to execute any documents necessary to accept the grant on the City's behalf.
  - b. Authorize the Fire Department to deposit FY2020 PSGP reimbursement grant funds into Fund 335, Department 38, Account to be determined;
  - c. Authorize the execution of a contract with a vendor to conduct Marine Firefighter Training courses within the grant performance period in an amount not to exceed \$133,400;
  - d. Authorize the Controller to transfer reimbursement grant funds from Fund 335, Department 38, Account TBD to LAFD Special Training Fund 40J, Account 3840JB;
  - e. Authorize the Controller to transfer funds from LAFD Special Training Fund 40J, Account 3840JB to General Fund 100, Department 38, Account 001098 Variable Staffing Overtime for staffing backfill/overtime; upon submission of proper documentation by LAFD of actual costs incurred from the Advanced Marine Firefighting Training Courses, subject to the review and approval of the City Administrative Officer (CAO); and,
  - f. Authorize the LAFD to prepare Controller instructions for any technical adjustments, subject to the approval of the CAO, and authorize the Controller to implement the instructions.

## **FISCAL IMPACT**

The LAFD will fund the grant-related expenditures of up to \$303,483 associated with the FY 2020 Port Security Grant Program. FEMA will reimburse LAFD the required cost share of up to \$227,612 (75%), with the remaining LAFD cost share amount of up to \$75,871 (25%) to be absorbed by the LAFD Special Training Fund.

#### **Article I - Summary Description of Award**

The terms of the approved Investment Justification(s) and Budget Detail Worksheet(s) submitted by the recipient are incorporated into the terms of this Federal award, subject to the additional description and limitations stated in this Agreement Article and the limitations stated in subsequent reviews by FEMA of the award budget. Investments not listed in this Agreement Article are not approved for funding under this award.

Investment 2: Marine Firefighter I & II Training and Exercise is fully funded for \$227612.

#### **Article II - Activities Conducted Abroad**

Recipients must ensure that project activities carried on outside the United States are coordinated as necessary with appropriate government authorities and that appropriate licenses, permits, or approvals are obtained.

#### **Article III - Reporting of Matters Related to Recipient Integrity and Performance**

If the total value of any currently active grants, cooperative agreements, and procurement contracts from all federal awarding agencies exceeds \$10,000,000 for any period of time during the period of performance of this federal award, then the recipients must comply with the requirements set forth in the government-wide Award Term and Condition for Recipient Integrity and Performance Matters located at 2 C.F.R. Part 200, Appendix XII, the full text of which is incorporated here by reference in the award terms and conditions.

#### **Article IV - Trafficking Victims Protection Act of 2000 (TVPA)**

Any cost allocable to a particular federal financial assistance award provided for in 2 C.F.R. Part 200, Subpart E may not be charged to other federal financial assistance awards to overcome fund deficiencies; to avoid restrictions imposed by federal statutes, regulations, or federal financial assistance award terms and conditions; or for other reasons.
