

HOMELESSNESS AND POVERTY COMMITTEE REPORT relative to recommended local initiatives that align with the Comprehensive Crisis Response Strategy, and necessary resources for establishing a Right to Housing framework within the City.

Recommendations for Council action, pursuant to Motion (O'Farrell - Ridley-Thomas - Martinez - Blumenfield):

1. RECEIVE AND FILE the verbal status report to the Homelessness and Poverty Committee provided by the City Administrative Officer (CAO), with the assistance of the Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority (LASHA) and the Chief Legislative Analyst (CLA) on recommended local initiatives that align with the Governor's Council of Regional Homeless Advisors' *Comprehensive Crisis Response Strategy*, as directed by the Council on February 19, 2020.
2. INSTRUCT the Los Angeles Housing and Community Investment Department (HCIDLA), with the assistance of the CAO, LASHA, CLA and the City Attorney, to report back in 60 days on what resources are necessary for the goal of establishing a Right to Housing framework within the City of Los Angeles, including the following:
 - a. A legal framework and proposed implementation strategy, which includes targets, funding and a timeline, to pilot an effort to achieve a Right to Housing.
 - b. An assessment of available funding to implement the aforementioned Right to Housing and the Comprehensive Crisis Response Strategy, in the broader context of the City's current efforts to end homelessness, and the extent to which these resources would need to be further scaled up, in partnership with the County, State and Federal Government.

Fiscal Impact Statement: Neither the CAO nor the CLA has completed a financial analysis of this report.

On February 25, 2021, the Housing Committee waived consideration of the above matter. This matter is now submitted to the Council for consideration.
