Subject: **2020 DEOXYRIBONUCLEIC ACID CAPACITY ENHANCEMENT AND BACKLOG REDUCTION PROGRAM GRANT**

RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Council, subject to the approval of the Mayor:

1. Authorize the Chief of Police, or designee, to:
 - a. Retroactively apply for and subsequently accept the grant award for the 2020 Deoxyribonucleic Acid (DNA) Capacity Enhancement and Backlog Reduction Program in the amount of \$1,270,014 for the period of October 1, 2020 through September 30, 2022 from the United States Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance;
 - b. Negotiate and execute the grant award agreement, subject to the approval of the City Attorney as to form;
2. Authorize the Los Angeles Police Department to:
 - a. Spend up to the total grant amount of \$1,270,014 in accordance with the grant award agreement;
 - b. Submit grant reimbursement requests to the grantor and deposit the grant receipts in the Police Department Grant Fund No. 339, Department No. 70;
 - c. Prepare Controller instructions for any technical adjustments as necessary to implement Mayor and Council intentions, subject to the approval of the City Administrative Officer, and authorize the Controller to implement the instructions;

3. Authorize the Controller to:

- a. Establish a grant receivable and appropriate \$1,270,014 to appropriation account, account number to be determined, within Fund No. 339, Department No. 70, for the receipt and disbursement of the 2020 DNA Capacity Enhancement and Backlog Reduction Program grant; and,

4. Authorize the City Clerk to:

- a. Place the following action relative to the 2020 DNA Capacity Enhancement and Backlog Reduction Program on the City Council agenda on July 1, 2021 or the first meeting thereafter:

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SUMMARY

The Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) is seeking retroactive approval to apply for and accept a \$1,270,014 grant award for the 2020 Deoxyribonucleic Acid (DNA) Capacity Enhancement and Backlog Reduction Program from the United States Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance. The grant award has a performance period of October 1, 2020 through September 30, 2022. No matching funds are required.

The 2020 DNA Capacity Enhancement and Backlog Reduction Program provides funding to state and local units of government with existing crime laboratories that conduct DNA analysis to process, record, screen, and analyze forensic DNA and DNA database samples. Funding will also be utilized to increase the capacity of public forensic DNA and DNA database laboratories to process more DNA samples, thereby helping to reduce the number of forensic DNA and DNA database samples awaiting analysis.

Funding from this grant will allow the LAPD's Forensic Science Division, Serology/DNA Unit (SDU) to analyze at least 539 additional DNA cases. Funds from the grant award will be used for personnel overtime, travel, equipment, supplies, and other related costs that will enhance the LAPD's ability to meet existing and future demands for DNA screening and testing.

The 2020 DNA Capacity Enhancement and Backlog Reduction Program grant funding provides \$1,270,014 to support the following expenses:

The grant budget provides funding for civilian Criminalists and support staff to process DNA cases on an overtime basis; travel expenses for training and continuing educations of DNA analysts; equipment purchase of a polarized light microscope and a wet-vacuum DNA collection tool; and, the purchase of DNA reagent supplies. Other expenses includes registration fees for training and conferences, as well as costs related to renovating SDU's existing cubicles and laboratory space.

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT

Approval of the recommendations within this report will have no additional impact to the General Fund and will allow for the expenditure of \$1,270,014 in 2020 Deoxyribonucleic Acid Capacity Enhancement and Backlog Reduction Program grant funds from the United States Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance. No matching funds are required for this grant.

FINANCIAL POLICIES STATEMENT

The recommendations provided in this report are in compliance with the City's Financial Policies in that one-time grant funding will be utilized for one-time program expenditures.
