**Comments for Public Posting:** I am highly supportive of Councilmember Buscaino's proposal. The current situation is untenable and incredibly dangerous. I live near an encampment (Military/Sardis) that has sprouted up during COVID. Given the suspension of Municipal Code 56.11 enforcement, I am repeatedly told by Paul Koretz's team that nothing can be done to address the heaps of trash, drug dealing, human feces and urine piled up, and debris/bulky items that litter the sidewalk and street. Walking in my once quiet and peaceful neighborhood now reminds me of my study abroad trip in New Delhi.
