DISCUSSION

This grant will fund person-screening and off-leash explosives detection canine training for Emergency Services Division's Bomb Detection K9 Unit. Hosted by Aspen Creek, this 80-hour course will run for two weeks from February 14, 2021 to February 26, 2021, locally at Dodger Stadium. Participants will learn how to properly utilize and maintain the training of the Unit's person-screening and off-leash explosives detection canines. In addition, they will also learn operational tactics when deploying the canines. Upon successful completion of the course, handlers will be evaluated for national certification by Master Trainer, an independent third party.




