The Cannabis Procedures Ordinance limits the number of Retail Commercial Cannabis Activity Licenses by Community Plan Area (CPA) based on the definition of Undue Concentration under Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC) Section 104.01(a)(48). An area is considered unduly concentrated when DCR issues the maximum number of these license types in that CPA.

Explain how the Commercial Cannabis Activity will serve the public convenience or necessity (attach and number additional pages if necessary):

There are multiple reasons our application should meet the public convenience and necessity threshold to be approved. First, Sun Valley is a heavily populated region of the city that is located very closely to other densely populated neighborhoods. Second, support for cannabis legalization was especially high in this region, suggesting support for legal cannabis businesses and consumption. Third, the massive scale of illegal dispensaries (which is well documented) in this region suggests strong consumer base and the need for legal, safe and compliant options for the local community. Fourth, Sun Valley is a very diverse community filled with a wide range of age groups, ethnicities and social economic backgrounds. Thus, cannabis retail options should reflect these demographics, which the current allotment of retail licenses cannot do. Fifth, Sun Valley sees an abundance of visitors that are like to find it convenient to

stop by Sun Valley to purchase legal cannabis. This is mainly because Sun Valley is easily accessible as it is nestled between the 210, 170 and 5 freeways, which, when combined, represent significant traffic coming through Sun Valley. Finally, Sun Valley is adjacent to Burbank where cannabis retail sales are illegal, requiring residents to explore other nearby options. Consequently, this drives traffic toward Sun Valley and requires there to be more options to meet the demand.
