

HOMELESSNESS AND POVERTY COMMITTEE REPORT relative to Homeless Housing, Assistance, and Prevention (HHAP) funding for the City's YMCA Shower Program and the Portable Hygiene Station program.

Recommendations for Council action as initiated by Motion (Ridley-Thomas - Raman),  
SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE MAYOR:

1. APPROVE up to \$2,706,000 of HHAP funding from Category 5- Street Strategy, Outreach, Public Health, and Hygiene Programs line item for the City's YMCA Shower Program (\$1.1M) and the Portable Hygiene Station Program (\$1.5M) to provide continued hygiene services to people experiencing homeless from January to June 2021, as amended by the Homelessness and Poverty Committee.
2. AUTHORIZE the Controller to transfer \$1,119,000 from the HHAP Special Fund Grant Fund No. 62Y, Account No. 10S656 to the Bureau of Sanitation (BOS) Fund No. 100/82, Appropriation Unit No. 003040 for the YMCA shower program, as amended by the Homelessness and Poverty Committee.
3. AUTHORIZE the BOS and the Department of General Services (GSD) to prepare any additional documents, controller instructions, or make any technical corrections or clarifications, if necessary, consistent with the Mayor and Council action in this matter, to effectuate the intent of this Motion and AUTHORIZE the Controller to implement these instructions, as amended by the Homelessness and Poverty Committee.
4. AUTHORIZE the Controller to transfer \$1,516,000 from the HHAP Special Fund Grant Fund No. 62Y, Account No. 10S656 to the GSD Fund No. 100/40, Account No. 003040 for the portable hygiene stations, as amended by the Homelessness and Poverty Committee.

Fiscal Impact Statement: Neither the City Administrative Officer nor the Chief Legislative Analyst has completed a financial analysis of this report.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted.

SUMMARY:

At a regular meeting held on April 8, 2021, the Homelessness and Poverty Committee considered Motion (Ridley-Thomas - Raman) relative to HHAP funding for the City's YMCA Shower Program and the Portable Hygiene Station program. After providing an opportunity for public comment, the Committee recommended adopting the Motion as amended. This matter is now submitted to the Council for consideration.
