#### RECOMMENDED ACTIONS

#### DISCUSSION

The 2018 Strategies for Policing Innovation Program grant provides funding to police agencies to identify and address the most pressing crime problems; to institute lasting operational and organizational changes; and, to foster reliance on evidence-based practices, data, and technology.

The Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance has approved \$53,512 to be moved from the Travel and Equipment categories to the Supplies and Other categories. This modification will allow the Department to purchase additional supplies and software to support the LAPD Homicide Library. Additionally, \$150,000 within the Contracts category was approved to be reallocated from University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA), who is no longer involved in the program, to Justice Strategies and Securities, Inc. (JSS), who will be performing the scope of work originally contracted to UCLA. The JSS will collaborate with Indiana University using machine learning techniques to analyze homicide data.

The LAPD's Strategies for Policing Innovation (SPI) project's budget included \$375,000 in Contracts Category, split between Justice & Security Strategies (JSS) for \$225,000 and University of Southern California (UCLA) for \$150,000.  UCLA's involvement was to work with JSS and LAPD to create and use a new instrument/algorithm that assists in using the predictors in the field. The JSS will not be taking on this role, resulting in an increase in their budget. UCLA will no longer be involved with LAPD 2018 SPI project, grant # 2018 WYBX 0002.  Additionally, the grantee has move funds from Travel and Equipment into allowable Supplies. I support this request and K.McNamee's approval is also attached. I have also emailed the grantee requesting documentation that the FFATA reporting is completed by the end of March, 2020 H.Wiley

### FY 2018 Strategies for Policing Innovation Grant # 2018 WYBX 0002 Grant Adjustment Modification – Budget Modification

The Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) requests approval for a Grant Adjustment Modification: Financial/Budget Modification. Below is a summary of the modification being requested:

Below is the breakdown and justification for the changes.

Travel: Travel allocation has been decreased to reflect the inability of travel due to the

COVID-19 pandemic travel restrictions.

Equipment: LAPD identified some cost adjustments with the initial estimate and is now

modifying identified high speed scanner as \$195,000

Supplies:: Additional supplies were identified to equip the LAPD Homicide Library. These

items include CPU, monitors, laptop, tablet, and printers. All these are to directly outfit the LAPD Homicide Library. They were set up in the cubicles for use by investigators and library staff. The scanned Murder Books (discs and eventually on-line) are accessible through the computers and monitors on the main floor of the library. Detectives assigned to the library also need laptops and tablets to work

remotely This need was initially conveyed on April 2020.

Subaward/Procurement Contract: The LAPD's Strategies for Policing Innovation (SPI) project's budget included \$375,000 in Contracts Category, split between Justice & Security Strategies (JSS) for \$225,000 and University of Southern California (UCLA) for \$150,000. UCLA's involvement was to work with JSS and LAPD to create and use a new instrument/algorithm that assists in using the predictors in the field. The JSS will not be taking on this role, resulting in an increase in their budget.

UCLA. \$(150,000) The UCLA will no longer be involved with LAPD 2018 SPI project, grant # 2018 WYBX 0002.

JSS. \$150,000 JSS will be taking in the scope of work that was originally taken by UCLA. JSS will be subcontracting sub-contracting with Dr. George Mohler of Indiana University/Purdue University Indianapolis. Dr. Mohler has worked extensively with Dr. Brantingham and Dr. Uchida of JSS and is well-versed in machine learning techniques and method and solving homicides. They have collaborated and wrote an article together on this subject. Dr. Mohler will assist with advanced statistical analyses; in particular, he will assist with machine learning techniques to analyze homicide data.

Other:

The LAPD's grant program enhances and augments the investigations of homicides and shootings in Los Angeles, particularly those that involve gangs. To achieve this goal, the LAPD Homicide Library, which is close to 20 miles away from LAPD headquarter, is undergoing enhancements. However, LAPD Command Staff and LAPD detectives that needs access to the Homicide Library documents and information, are located at the LAPD headquarter. To accommodate this need, LAPD is proposing to allocate a separate, secure room on the third floor of LAPD headquarter. High-speed Internet access, computers, monitors, printers, scanners, and other supplies are needed in the room. Estimated costs are about \$40,000. There is no change on the program goals and objectives

This change was approved through a Grant Adjustment Notice: Program Office Approval on November 2019
