**Comments for Public Posting:** With the mayor's orders of allowing un-housed encampments 24/7 in public spaces, it has become a MAJOR health hazard TO EVERYONE (both housed & un-housed) and additionally, the city is not ADA compliant with sidewalks blocked and streets full of "trash" or their "belongings" Un-housed residents and vehicle dwellers need to be forced into treatment and/or forced into housing, which ever is needed first. If they are addicted or mentally ill, how can you allow them to make decisions for themselves, and say "no, I don't want to be housed" ? There are veterans, women and kids too that need help. In our district alone (CD12) there have been 2 missing females within hours of each other this week. With the increase in housing built for the un-housed and/or vehicle dwellers, there should be no reason for street and sidewalk encampments. Encampments need a Comprehensive Cleaning ASAP, not only in our area of CD12, but citywide. Several Tents with males in them on Canoga Ave., at Devonshire in Chatsworth 91311 2. Lone elderly female at bus-stop on Devonshire, at De Soto in Chatsworth 91311 3. Several Tents and overflow of their trash or belongings on Nordhoff St., in between Owensmouth & Jordan Ave., in Chatsworth 91311 4. Balboa & Devonshire, in Granada Hills 5. Chatsworth Train/Bus Station-10040 Old Depot Plaza Rd, Chatsworth, CA 91311
