Moving the unhoused to various places around the Westside just means that service providers like LAHSA will have to travel more miles to get to everyone. I (and others) have long supported centralized facilities where service providers, including doctors, nurses, case managers, drugs' counselors jobs counselors and others can work with those unhoused. The Javits' Center in NYC went up in days and was filled with cots for those with covid. We have unused malls, buildings, and hospitals that could be brought up to compliance. These facilities would have security so the occupants feel safe. What we need is leadership -- for the City, County, State and Federal Government (FEMA) to come together to create seamless care for the homeless. Proposition HHH is a failure; the City's own Comptroller says so. Half a mil for one unit is highway robbery. (And environmental rules can be skipped over.)
