MOTION

California Governor Gavin Newsom recently announced a \$100 billion California Comeback Plan that includes a \$12 billion investment to address homelessness. There are significant investments in homelessness prevention, rental support, new housing opportunities for people at risk of homelessness and for homeless families, and grants to local governments to transition the homeless to more stable housing. Additionally, the Plan includes a \$1.5 billion investment to clean public spaces near highways and transform public spaces through arts and cultural projects. This clean-up initiative is expected to create an estimated 15,000 jobs, including for people experiencing or exiting homelessness, at-risk youth, veterans, and formerly incarcerated individuals.

I THEREFORE MOVE that the Chief Legislative Analyst and City Administrative Officer be directed to report on the \$100 billion California Comeback Plan, including the State's \$1.5 billion investment to clean public spaces near highways, and identify the amounts of funding and planned expenditures from the \$100 billion that will benefit the City of Los Angeles.
