Comments for Public Posting: My name is Mitch Blumenfeld and I am COO of Acme Display. We owns about 450 running feet on Broadway between 38th and 39th. Our building is about 65,000 sq. ft. and we have been so close to having a total catastrophe due to the homeless encampment that is perched up against our east boundary. This has been a homeless haven for the past 5 years of our ownership. Our building has been severely damaged by no less than 7 encampment fires in the past 12 months. Last week, not only was there a major fire, but a murder of a homeless resident in his motor home. Our City needs to start protecting the rights and property of the taxpayers. Our insurance rates have gone up over 35% because of the situation adjacent to our building. We currently have over \$50,000 damage to the brick side of our building. If I file a claim, it will get paid but we will then we will be cancelled. Property owners NEED protection from these encampments. Additionally, it has hurt our retail business as many customers do not want to come to the area for their business. All we are told by Councilman Price's office, LAPD, and LAFD is that there is nothing that can be done. I don't believe that. There are ordinances that have been passed, but just not enforced. The City needs to put the tax paying citizens first and clear our sidewalks so fencing can go up so we can then repair our property. If any of the Council members were business owners, I am sure you would understand and ACT to protect your business and property.
