Community Impact Statement in support of expanding the approved City Council File 20-1365 to include a return to relaxed parking enforcement in wake of surging COVID-19 cases.

Dear Mayor Garcetti and Los Angeles City Councilmembers,

On November 20th, [Los Angeles County recorded nearly 5,000 new coronavirus](#) cases on Thursday Nov. 19th, the most it has seen in any one day since the pandemic began. The [L.A. County Department of Public Health has reported](#) an average of 2,925.4 new coronavirus cases per day over the past seven days, which is a 103% increase from two weeks ago. Over that same period, there have been 17 deaths per day. Additionally, the number of hospitalizations is growing. There are now 1,238 patients with a confirmed case, an increase from fourteen days ago.

On November 13th, Governor Gavin Newsom [issued travel advisories](#) urging visitors entering their states or returning home from travel outside these states to self-quarantine to slow the spread of the virus. The travel advisories urge against non-essential out-of-state travel, ask people to self-quarantine for 14 days after arriving from another state or country and encourage residents to stay local. On November 19th, the [California Department of Public Health issued a Limited Stay at Home order](#), requiring that all gatherings and all activities conducted outside the residences cease between 10:00pm and 5:00am.

On March 16th, [Mayor Eric Garcetti relaxed parking enforcement](#) across the City as part of the emergency response to COVID-19, putting a temporary halt to the issuance of several citations so that Angelenos can more effectively practice the safe social distancing necessary during the outbreak.

On August 14th, [Mayor Eric Garcetti said](#), "All of us have a role to play in defeating this virus and saving lives, and no one should worry about facing extra financial burdens when they're keeping their family, friends, and community safe during this crisis."

Therefore, the Silver Lake Neighborhood Council strongly urges that Mayor Eric Garcetti and the Los Angeles Department of Transportation (LADOT) return to relaxed parking enforcement procedures immediately to ensure Angelenos can safely follow public health & safety guidelines to mitigate the spread of the virus.
