

INFORMATION, TECHNOLOGY, AND GENERAL SERVICES COMMITTEE REPORT relative to an Amendment to the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) for office space in the Police Administration Building for joint task force and law enforcement programs.

Recommendation for Council action:

AUTHORIZE the Department of General Services to negotiate and execute an Amendment to the MOA between the FBI and the City for the FBI's continued occupancy and to make further modifications to the office space in the Police Administration Building located at 100 West First Street, for joint task force and law enforcement programs, for a term of ten years, commencing on the date of execution.

Fiscal Impact Statement: The Municipal Facilities Committee reports that there is no additional General Fund impact beyond a potential contribution of approximately \$15,000 towards space modifications using monies budgeted within the annual capital program budgeted for police facilities, with a contribution of up to \$113,440 from the FBI to address the majority of the projected capital improvement costs. Under the proposed terms, no additional fees would be charged to the FBI for the use of this space.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted


SUMMARY

At the meeting held on August 19, 2021, your Information, Technology, and General Services Committee considered the Municipal Facilities Committee report relative to an Amendment to the MOA with the FBI for office space in the Police Administration Building for joint task force and law enforcement programs.
