DEAR PLUM Committee:

I urge you to strongly support without revisions, the Cultural Heritage Commission nomination of the Studio City/Weddington Golf and Tennis as a Los Angeles Historic Cultural Monument, which the Cultural Heritage Commission ruled "that the property conforms with the definition of a Monument..." . This post World War II-era recreational facility is one of the few Studio City landmarks still standing, virtually unaltered from when it originally opened in 1956. Its 16 acres is the largest open space in Studio City, a lovely designed golf course still in operation after more than 70 years that serves the needs of all, rich and poor, men, women, or children, and any ethnicity, rising in lock step with Studio City as it grew from a sparsely populated neighborhood into a prosperous Los Angeles suburb. The planned landscape is filled with over 350 large mature trees defining the fairways. It was constructed and operated by former golf pro Joe Kirkwood Jr. who brought golf to the middle classes, introducing it to women and children in a public setting.

Please preserve it as is for future generations.
