Subject: **COVID-19 EMERGENCY RESPONSE ACCOUNT – GENERAL CITY PURPOSES FUND STATUS REPORT – WEEK ENDING FRIDAY, OCTOBER 1, 2021**

On March 17, 2020, Council adopted a motion (C.F. 20-0147-S46) to transfer \$20.0 million from the Reserve Fund to the General City Purposes Fund under a new account entitled “COVID-19 Emergency Response” in order to provide City Departments additional resources to address and respond to the COVID-19 pandemic. In accordance with the motion, the City Administrative Officer (CAO) is authorized to spend these funds at the direction of the Mayor and must provide reports to the City Council on expenses incurred and purposes for which the funds were authorized.

On April 7, 2020, in order to continue citywide efforts to address COVID-19, and in accordance with Los Angeles City Charter Section 231(i) and Los Angeles Administrative Code Sections 8.29 and 8.30, the Mayor authorized an additional appropriation of \$50.0 million from the Building and Safety Building Permit Enterprise Fund to the COVID-19 Emergency Response account, increasing the overall appropriation to \$70.0 million. The City Council subsequently approved this loan on April 29, 2020 (C.F. 20-0501).

On April 30, 2020, the Mayor authorized an additional \$75.0 transfer to the COVID-19 Emergency Response account from the Building and Safety Building Permit Enterprise Fund to fund ongoing COVID-19 response needs, thereby increasing the total appropriation to \$145.0 million. The City Council approved the loan on May 5, 2020 (C.F. 20-0530). Through this motion, the City Council dedicated \$25.0 million of the \$75.0 million transfer to enhancements to the Senior Meals Delivery Program. As of September 10, 2020, the CAO, under the direction of the Mayor, had approved the full amount for this purpose.

On July 17, 2020, the Board of Public Works approved a transfer of \$75.0 million from the Public Works Trust Fund to the COVID-19 Emergency Response account, as authorized by the Mayor, to meet the City’s ongoing COVID-19 expenditures (C.F. 20-0147-S53).

To continue response efforts, the 2021-22 Adopted Budget included additional funding of \$40.0 million for the COVID Emergency Fund. Of this, \$15.0 million is available in the General City Purposes, COVID-19 Emergency Response Account and \$25.0 million is available in the Unappropriated Balance.

During the 2021-22 budget deliberations, Council instructed the CAO to report to the Budget and Finance Committee on how Council could take a more proactive role in decision-making in the City’s response to the pandemic (C.F. 21-0600-S2). This Office is currently preparing that report.
