

PERSONNEL, AUDITS, AND ANIMAL WELFARE COMMITTEE REPORT relative to the re-exemption of one Police Administrator II (Class Code 9196-2) position for the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) from the Civil Service pursuant to Charter Section 1001(b).

Recommendation for Council action:

APPROVE the re-exemption of one Police Administrator II (Class Code 9196-2) position for the LAPD from the Civil Service pursuant to Charter Section 1001(b).

Fiscal Impact Statement: None submitted by the Mayor. The Chief Legislative Analyst has not completed a financial analysis of this report.

Summary:

On October 20, 2021, your Committee considered an October 13, 2021 Communication from the Mayor relative to the re-exemption of one Police Administrator II (Class Code 9196-2) position for the LAPD from the Civil Service pursuant to Charter Section 1001(b). According to the Mayor, Charter Section 1001(b) allows up to 150 persons to be exempt, of which 142 are approved. Approval of this request will increase the count. As of October 13, 2021, this request will be in the 145<sup>th</sup> position of the 150 exemptions. There are an additional 50 exempt positions added by the City Council pursuant to Charter Section 1001(b)(4), of which 6 are filled.

The Police Administrator II position was previously approved for exemption under 1001(b) by Council and was subsequently filled. The position was vacated on September 4, 2016 and deleted from the count. Charter Section 1001(b)(1) requires that, "When the position is vacated, the exemption shall terminate unless reauthorized in accordance with this subsection."

The Police Administrator II position will serve as the Assistant Commanding Officer of the newly created Community Safety Partnership Bureau (CSPB) that will expand the department's Community Safety Partnership (CSP) program and reinforce efforts to reimagine policing by focusing on a community-based approach; will chair LAPD's newly established Regional Advisory Council; and oversee the operations of the Safety Strategy and Innovation Center (SSIC) that will be responsible for strategizing, crafting, and implementing policies and best practices related to the CSP model. Through the SSIC, this position will be responsible for bringing together community stakeholders to partner

with City leadership and LAPD to shape the strategic plans for CSP sites and the implementation of the CSP model department wide. After consideration and having provided an opportunity for public comment, the Committee moved to recommend approval of the exemption. This matter is now submitted to Council for its consideration.
