I sent the following e-mail message to Tom Jacobson, the president of GLAZA, regarding the proposals for the Zoo upgrade: 'The aerial tram is an idea that will not die. It would be too expensive and too intrusive. Upgrade the ground transportation (trams) to show off the zoo and to improve accessibility. A restaurant serving adult beverages is a good idea, a vineyard in a zoo is not. Climbing walls are tacky. You find them in small amusement parks, shopping malls and carnivals.
