Recommendations for Council action, as initiated by Motion (Koretz – Krekorian):

1. INSTRUCT the Department of Public Works, City Administrative Officer (CAO), Streets LA, and other relevant City Departments and offices, to report on the availability of State funding to augment and support ongoing and future City projects and work involving climate change mitigation and resilience being conducted by the Bureau of Sanitation, Climate Emergency Mobilization Office, Office of the Petroleum Administrator, and Office of City Forest Management.
2. INSTRUCT the Planning Department to report on the availability of State funding to augment and support the Planning Department projects involving climate change mitigation and habitat connectivity, including wildlife corridors.
