You are hereby notified that the Planning and Land Use Management (PLUM) Committee of the Los Angeles City Council will hold a public hearing **telephonically** during a Special Meeting on **Tuesday, November 30, 2021**, at approximately **2:00 P.M.**, or soon thereafter, to consider the following: Negative Declaration, No. ENV-2019-7934-ND, and related California Environmental Quality Act findings; reports from the Los Angeles City Planning Commission and Department of City Planning, and proposed Ordinance amending the Los Angeles Municipal Code to include Section 12.21.H for the implementation of California Government Code Section 65590-65590.1, also known as the Mello Act, which seeks to preserve and expand the number of affordable dwelling units in the Coastal Zone in the State of California; the Ordinance replaces the process and project review requirements of existing Interim Administrative Procedures for projects that result in demolition, loss, or conversion of Residential Units and/or development of new Residential Units in the Coastal Zone, and will establish the Coastal Zone Affordable Housing Trust Fund to allow in lieu fees related to the Mello Act; for the Coastal Zone Area located within the Brentwood – Pacific Palisades, Venice, Palms – Mar Vista – Del Rey, Westchester – Playa Del Rey, San Pedro and Wilmington – Harbor City Community Plans in the City of Los Angeles

**Note:** If you challenge this proposed action in court, you may be limited to raising only those issues you or someone else raised at the public hearing described in this notice, or in written correspondence delivered to the City Clerk at, or prior to, the public hearing. Any written correspondence delivered to the City Clerk before the City Council's final action on a matter will become a part of the administrative record. The time in which you may seek judicial review of any final action by the City Council is limited by California Code of Civil Procedure Section 1094.6 which provides that an action pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure Section 1094.5 challenging the Council's action must be filed no later than the 90th day following the date on which the Council action becomes final.
