CATEGORICAL EXEMPTION and PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE REPORT relative to the vacation of a portion of the T-shaped alley north of Olympic Boulevard and east of Albany Street, and a portion of the westerly side of Blaine Street north of Olympic Boulevard, VAC-E1401339 (Vacation).

## Recommendations for Council action:

- 1. FIND that the Vacation is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act of 1970, pursuant to Article III, Class 5(3) of the City's Environmental Guidelines.
- 2. FIND that the street vacation proceedings pursuant to the Public Streets, Highways and Service Easements Vacation Law be instituted for the vacation of the public right-of way indicated below and shown on the map of the September 14, 2021 City Engineer report, attached to the Council file:
  - a. The southern east/west alley north of Olympic Boulevard and east of Albany Street.
  - b. A portion of the north/south alley north of Olympic Boulevard and east of Albany Street, from the southern east/west alley to approximately 44 feet northerly thereof.
  - c. A portion of westerly side of Blaine Avenue north of Olympic Boulevard.
- 3. FIND that there is a public benefit to the Vacation. Upon vacation of the street, the City is relieved of its ongoing obligation to maintain the street. In addition, the City is relieved of any potential liability that might result from continued ownership of the involved street and alley easements.
- 4. FIND that the Vacation is in substantial conformance with the purposes, intent and provisions of the General Plan, in conformance with Section 556 of the City Charter.
- 5. FIND that the Vacation is not necessary for non-motorized transportation facilities, in conformance with Section 892 of the California Streets and Highways Code.
- 6. FIND that the Vacation is not necessary for present or prospective public use, in conformance with Section 8324 of the California Streets and Highways Code.
- 7. ADOPT said City Engineer's report with the conditions contained therein.

<u>Fiscal Impact Statement</u>: The City Engineer reports that the petitioner has paid a fee of \$14,980 for the investigation of this request pursuant to Section 7.42 of the Los Angeles Administrative Code (LAAC). Any deficit fee to recover the cost pursuant to Section 7.44 of the LAAC will be required of the petitioner. Maintenance of the public easement by City forces will be eliminated.

Community Impact Statement: None submitted

## SUMMARY

At the meeting held on October 13, 2021, your Public Works Committee considered the recommendations of the City Engineer as contained in its aforementioned report. The City Engineer reports that the area sought to be vacated is a portion of the T-shaped alley north of Olympic Boulevard and east of Albany Street, and a portion of the westerly side of Blaine Street north of Olympic Boulevard (a map of the area is included in the City Engineer report). The purpose of the vacation request is to consolidate the area with the adjoining properties at Olympic Primary Center (formerly Belmont Primary Center #11). This vacation procedure is being processed under procedures established by Council on March 5, 2002 as detailed in Council file No. 01-1459.

After having provided an opportunity for public comment, the Committee moved to recommend approval of the recommendations as contained in said City Engineer report as detailed above. This matter is now submitted to Council for its consideration.
