I would like to recommend adding to the Exemptions, that Special consideration for culturally sensitive areas that are NOT yet officially recognized by L.A. City or County ordinances be included. The local Legislators in culturally sensitive areas should be consulted and authorized to designate historic status regardless to official listing.
