Subject: **FISCAL YEAR 2021 URBAN AREAS SECURITY INITIATIVE GRANT APPLICATION**

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### RECOMMENDATIONS

That the Council:

1. Authorize the Mayor's Office of Public Safety to submit the Fiscal Year 2021 Urban Areas Security Initiative (FY21 UASI) grant application to the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES) on behalf of the City of Los Angeles and the Los Angeles/Long Beach (LA/LB) Urban Area, for the estimated \$55,420,000 allocation;
2. Adopt the Governing Body Resolution provided as Attachment A to this report to designate the City entities that will apply for and manage Federal financial assistance provided by the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) and sub-granted through the State of California; and,
3. Instruct the Office of the City Administrative Officer (CAO) to report back with the necessary actions to approve and accept the FY21 UASI award once applications are evaluated, and funding is allocated by the DHS, subject to Council and Mayor approval.

### SUMMARY

The Mayor's Office of Public Safety (Mayor's Office) is providing notification to the City Council of the submission of the Fiscal Year 2021 Urban Areas Security Initiative (FY21 UASI) grant with an estimated \$55,420,000 allocation and an anticipated grant period of September 2021 through May 2024. The Mayor's Office also requests authority to adopt the Governing Body Resolution, which is provided as Attachment A, to this report. Detailed funding information for specific projects under the FY21 UASI grant is unknown at this time and the Mayor's Office will release a separate report once the award notification is received.

The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) issued a solicitation for the FY21 UASI grant in February 2021. The DHS awards funds to the State Administrative Agent, which is the Cal OES for the State of California, who in turns disperses the funds to the Urban Areas.

### Application Process

The UASI grant application is developed through collaboration with public safety agencies representing the LA/LB Urban Area jurisdiction. The Urban Area Working Group, which is made up of 18 voting representatives from jurisdictions in the Urban Area, sets homeland security objectives, proposes programs to meet those objectives, and presents funding requests to meet each objective. The draft application is then reviewed and ratified by an 11-member Approval Authority, which represents the LA/LB Urban Area jurisdiction and includes four City of Los Angeles Representatives. The LA/LB Urban Area Governance Structure is included as Attachment B to this report. The Mayor's Office serves as the administrative and fiscal agent for all UASI awards and submits all grant applications and related documents on behalf of the LA/LB Urban Area jurisdiction.

The primary Investment Justifications (IJs) for the FY21 UASI application were developed by the Working Group with concurrence from the Approval Authority, taking into consideration the core capabilities and gaps of the LA/LB Urban Area and based on feedback provided by the Cal OES and the DHS. The IJs are as follows:

### Fiscal Year 2021 Urban Areas Security Initiative Investment Justifications

1. Strengthen interoperable and communications capabilities
2. Strengthen information sharing, collaboration capabilities, and law enforcement investigations
- 2A. Fusion Center/Joint Regional Intelligence Center (JRIC)
3. Protection of critical infrastructure and key resources (limited to commercial airports and seaports)
4. Catastrophic incident planning response and recovery

### Governing Body Resolution

As part of the application, the Cal OES requires the submission of the Governing Body Resolution (GRB), which is included as Attachment A to this report. The GBR authorize specified Los Angeles City Officials to execute for and on behalf of the City of Los Angeles any actions necessary for the purpose of obtaining federal assistance under FY21 UASI. The Mayor's Office will return to the City Council to request authority to accept the grant once the award notification is received from the Cal OES. At that time, detailed information regarding the funding for specific projects under the FY21 UASI award will be identified along with the allocations for each jurisdiction within the LA/LB Urban Area.

## **FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT**

Approval of the recommendations in this report will have no additional impact to the General Fund. No matching funds are required of this grant.

## **FINANCIAL POLICIES STATEMENT**

The City's Financial Policies are not applicable to the report recommendations since no funding commitment is being made at this time. Approval of the recommendations in this report will allow the Mayor's Office of Public Safety to submit the Fiscal Year 2021 Urban Areas Security Initiative grant application.
