**DRAFT ORDINANCE AMENDING ARTICLE 1, CHAPTER VII OF THE
LOS ANGELES MUNICIPAL CODE TO REPLACE THE CITY'S EXISTING TAXICAB
FRANCHISE REGULATORY FRAMEWORK WITH AN OPEN
MARKET PERMITTING SYSTEM**

Honorable Members:

Pursuant to your request, this Office has prepared and now transmits for your consideration the enclosed draft ordinance, approved as to form and legality. The draft ordinance amends Article 1, Chapter VII of the Los Angeles Municipal Code (LAMC) to replace the City's existing taxicab franchise regulatory framework with an open market permitting system. The ordinance contains an urgency clause. This ordinance must become effective on March 1, 2022, in order to preserve the City's ability to regulate the taxicab industry, as the taxicab franchises expire on February 28, 2022.

The new permit fees for the newly created taxicab open market permitting system will be transmitted by this Office in a separate draft ordinance amending LAMC Section 71.06.1 "Permit and Other Fees." A separate draft ordinance is necessary to ensure proper notice is given in accordance with the provisions of California Government Code Sections 66018 and 6062a. The amendments to LAMC Section 71.06.1 also include new permit fees for the City's Shared Mobility Device Program,

Private Ambulances, and other for hire vehicles regulated by the Department of Transportation.
