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Comments for Public Posting: Council members, I continue to be a homeless veteran in need of help. The saddest part of all this is that my 4 year old daughter and wife have also been homeless for 2 years now which feels like an eternity. I'm sure you are familiar with my situation as we have called and emailed you and your colleagues multiple times asking for help. The city will not allow me to evict and live in my house due to ITS OWN eviction moratorium. Relationship with the tenants has deteriorated due to the handling of the eviction moratorium by the city and giving them power over my property. They refuse to talk to me unless the city tells them to. It is clear the city will not give me a chance to live in my house and simply doesn't care. The previous council member Cedillo from my area left us to die. The city I represented during my service to our country continues to screw me willingly. I get suicidal every time I read that last sentence. I was such a proud Angeleno, always standing up for us against all the southerners in the service and east coast marines who would talk crap about LA, all for nothing. I have recently read an article about the county and city receiving more funding for PROJECT ROOMKEY, I think that is the answer to our issue. From my understanding, project roomkey houses homeless or at risk of being homeless Angelenos; something that the city has forced me to do but I get no funding from anybody except my VA disability compensation(which is what I've been using to help pay for the tenant bills instead of my own well being like it's intended) I have given up trying to recover my house. My wife and I have decided to sell the property. But even that is difficult because nobody wants to inherit our tenant issue that is being caused by the city. So this is what I've been thinking, Instead of keeping my house hostage why don't you guys buy the house from me and use it to house the homeless or at risk of homelessness and use it for Project Roomkey. Instead of forcing me to house Angelenos while still being homeless myself. 4844 York Blvd, Los Angeles, CA 90042 My Property above is in an area that went and continues to go through gentrification leaving more Angelenos at risk of homelessness than before. Please help me by helping Project Roomkey acquire my property for its cause. Why does everybody else under your supervision receive help but a homeless veteran suffering from PTSD get the cold shoulder? Or a homeless

toddler with no stable shelter get the cold shoulder? I don't want to kill myself but sometimes it seems like it's the only way to make the torment brought on by the city end. This is something that can help everyone present and future please help.
