

PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE REPORT relative to the grant application and award for the Fiscal Year (FY) 2021-22 Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Port Security Grant Program in the amount of \$150,000 for the period of September 1, 2021 through August 31, 2024.

Recommendations for Council action, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE MAYOR:

1. AUTHORIZE the Chief of Police, or designee, to:
  - a. Retroactively apply for and accept the grant award from the United States Department of Justice, Department of Homeland Security, Federal Emergency Management Agency, for Fiscal Year 2021 Port Security Grant Program (FY21 PSGP) in the amount of \$150,000 for the period of September 1, 2021 through August 31, 2024.
  - b. Negotiate and execute the grant award agreement, subject to the approval of the City Attorney as to form.
2. AUTHORIZE the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) to:
  - a. Spend up to the total grant amount of \$150,000 in accordance with the grant award agreement.
  - b. Submit grant reimbursement requests to the grantor and deposit the grant receipts in the Police Department Grant Fund No. 339/70.
  - c. Prepare Controller instructions for any technical adjustments, subject to the approval of the City Administrative Officer (CAO), and authorize the Controller to implement the instructions.
3. AUTHORIZE the Controller to:
  - a. Establish a grant receivable and appropriate \$150,000 to an appropriation account to be determined, in the Fund No. 339/70, for the receipt and disbursement of the FY21 PSGP funds.

Fiscal Impact Statement: The CAO reports that approval of the recommendations within this report will provide up to \$150,000 in funding to the LAPD for the FY21 PSGP. The LAPD will provide \$50,000 in expense account funding as an in-kind match to meet the 25-percent match requirement. This funding is already provided as a part of the Department's FY 2021-22 Adopted Budget. There is no impact to the General Fund as a result of these recommendations.

Financial Policies Statement: The CAO reports that the recommendations provided in this report comply with the City's Financial Policies in that one-time grant funding will be utilized for one-time program expenditures.
