Summary: At a Brown Act Compliant meeting held on January 12, 2022, the NoHo Neighborhood Council voted unanimously to support CF 21-1222, a motion directing LADOT to study implementation of a permanent Slow Streets program.

NoHo Neighborhood Council **SUPPORTS** CF #21-1222.

As one of the first neighborhood councils in the City of Los Angeles to take advantage of LADOT's Slow Streets program, we enthusiastically support the City making Slow Streets permanent and expanding the scope of the program.

In addition, we encourage the City to budget additional money towards expanding the program, both to areas that don't yet have Slow Streets, and to areas that wish to expand existing Slow Streets. Ultimately, we believe a city-wide network of Slow Streets can serve as LA's Neighborhood Enhanced Network (as defined on our Mobility Plan 2035), expanding opportunities for those that wish to walk, run, bike, or scoot around town.
