Comments for Public Posting: February 28, 2022 Dear Councilmembers, The Los Feliz/Hollywood Community asks the councilmembers to focus on the public health & safety issues caused by the proliferation of RVs in Los Feliz/Hollywood, specifically located along these locations: 1) Franklin Ave, between Western & Hillhurst. Franklin Avenue is an East / West Street from Vermont to Western Avenue, only one lane on North side of street (21 feet wide) with several cross streets and driveways. R1. 2) Talmadge, between Prospect & Franklin Avenue. R1. Vehicles illegally parking within 500 ft. of daycare, in between (3) schools. 3) Finley (between Alexandria to Commonwealth). Narrow street, R1 4) Riverside, between LF Blvd and Fletcher. 5) Cahuenga, between Franklin Avenue to Odin. 6) Cahuenga Blvd W. between Wright Ln and Barham – high fire severity zone. In order to regulate all the public health and safety hazards caused by these vehicles, we need to have the appropriate signs placed in these areas. So while we are in support of this motion, we need to have the proper regulations installed now, for the restoration of public health and safety in our community. This is an urgent situation now, that this extended covid ban on towing these vehicles in areas, where they were never legally allowed to be in the first place. As you know, there are many reasons why these vehicles are illegal in these areas. And these must immediately be redirected, out of our community and into safe parking lots. We truly believe that with various types of regulations, especially, no overnight parking (“Tow Away”) of oversize vehicles between 2:00AM and 6:00AM (LAMC 80.69.4), we will be able to realize our long-term goal of abating these various parking issues and making the Northeast/Hollywood areas safer, for all our constituents. We will also be able to have some oversight and enforcement to control the many public health and safety issues surrounding these vehicles stationed in our community. It is our opinion that a long-term solution is desperately needed. In the meantime, it is our hope that we can get assistance and have LAMC 80.69.4 signs placed in these trouble zones, so LADOT can assist us, in implementing parking regulations in these specified locations. More on the Public Health and Safety Hazards in these areas posed by these vehicles: Over the couple of years, residents continue to express public health and safety concerns in

relation to the narcotic activity, thefts and disturbances in the area, as well as illegal dumping and hazardous discharge from these oversized recreational vehicles. They illegally spill, dump or leak sewage onto public streets and into the public sewer system, dumping trash and attracting rats and disease. There are also frequent complaints about the stench of human waste coming from these large oversized vehicles. They also have illegally plugged into electricity, like the one that burned down the rv and front lawn of a home, along Franklin, near Laughlin Park. And also place their gas generators on the sidewalk, that obstruct the pedestrian path and cause noise disturbances, while gas fumes, fill up nearby residences. Citizens often complain about children having to walk by these vehicles to get to school and people, who may or may not be safe for children to walk by due to the threat of sexual predators or mentally unstable/drug addicted persons, displaying erratic behavior. These oversized vehicles also create a significant traffic hazard by limiting pedestrian line of vision when using the crosswalk. Limit visibility to cyclists and motorists. In addition, crime has been increasing in the area (thefts in area). These RVs obstruct views for both pedestrians crossing the street, and for cars making turns. Bike lanes are also blocked. Impacts visibility at driveways and intersections, reducing available on-street parking for residents and causing visual blight and a public nuisance. Emergency lanes are blocked, making it impossible for firetrucks and ambulances to safely drive through in emergencies. For too long, Los Feliz residents have sought relief from the increase of RVs, campers and other oversized vehicles, parking in front of residential and commercial zones. The parking issues consist of unregistered vehicles, and numerous parked recreational vehicles, campers, vans, and trailers. And lastly, this situation of the RV Slumlord, known as "Drago," in Los Feliz, who is renting out these vehicles to the unhoused, unregulated, must be addressed.
